MINUTES

Motion to Intervene in FERC Dockets

Background:

On February 28, 2018, Southern Star filed revised fuel reimbursement percentages. Southern Star states that it used a modified methodology approved in 2017 in Docket No. RP17-438 to calculate two components of its storage loss reimbursement percentage in its 2017 and 2018 annual fuel filings. For its Production Area FL&U percentage, Southern Star proposes an overall increase of 0.01% resulting in a total Production Area FL&U percentage of 1.01%. As to its Market Area FL&U percentage, Southern Star proposes an overall decrease of 0.21%, resulting in a total Market Area FL&U percentage of 0.68%. As to its Storage Injection FL&U percentage, Southern Star proposes an overall increase of .89%, resulting in a total Storage Injection percentage of 5.82%.

Southern Star states that there were no reportable gas losses from Department of Transportation ("DOT") reportable incidents during the 12-month period ending on December 31, 2017. Southern Star is required to submit a primary annual fuel filing including losses from DOT reportable incidents, and separately an alternate annual fuel filing with such losses removed to show their effect on the gas loss component of its FL&U percentages. Southern Star did not include an alternate annual fuel filing based on the fact that there were no reportable DOT incidents.

I would ask the Commission to approve the filing of a petition for intervention and if the need arises to make such comments as may be necessary to protect Kansas' ratepayers, in this matter.

Background:

On March 1, 2018, Kansas Pipeline, LLC ("KPC") filed revised Fuel Reimbursement Percentages.¹

On a total system wide basis KPC proposes an increase in FL&U for both the summer period (from 1.2380% to 3.0532%) and the winter period (from 1.2762% to 2.9769%). KPC asserts that the magnitude of the increases is "somewhat misleading" allegedly due to the unusually low FL&U reimbursement percentages established in KPC's 2017 FL&U FL&U rate case (Docket No. RP17-437-000). Nevertheless, KPC admits that the increases in the Fuel Reimbursement Percentages are due primarily to an increase in L&U volumes.

I would ask the Commission to approve the filing of a petition for intervention and to make such comments as may be necessary to protect Kansas' ratepayers, in this matter.

Motion:

I move the Commission to authorize its counsel to file a petition for intervention and to make such comments as may be necessary to protect Kansas' ratepayers in FERC Docket No. RP18-510.

Motion to Intervene in FERC Dockets

<u>Date</u>: March 13, 2018

Docket No. RP18-533

Background:

On March 1, 2018, TIGT filed a Fuel and Lost and Unaccounted for ("FL&U") Reimbursement and Power Cost Tracker Periodic Rate Adjustment report for the year ending in December 31, 2017. TIGT states that its proposed FL&U Reimbursement Percentages and Power Cost Charges reflect only the actual usage and throughput observed on the TIGT system for the 12 months ending December 31, 2017, plus applicable deferred account amounts.

TIGT requests a limited waiver of its Tariff to assess zero percent rates instead of negative rates for gas that flows solely on the Colorado Lateral facilities, and PAWS Wheeling Service. TIGT states that it will account for any over recoveries from the zero percent rates in applicable deferred accounts, thus returning such amounts to applicable shippers in its next FL&U/Tracker filing. Additionally, TIGT states that it established a separate service group and deferred accounts for PAWS fuel, but did not allocate any fuel to the wheeling Service under Rate Schedule PAWS.

I would ask the Commission to approve the filing of a petition for intervention and if the need arises to make such comments as may be necessary to protect Kansas' ratepayers, in this matter.

Motion:

I move the Commission to authorize its counsel to file a petition for intervention and if the need arises to make such comments as may be necessary to protect Kansas' ratepayers in FERC Docket No. RP18-533.

Proposed HR Directive 3/15/18
