What is the FCIP?

Budget-neutral approach to financing facility improvements

The FCIP, administered by the KCC's Energy Programs Division, facilitates the implementation and financing of energy conservation and other improvements in state, municipal, county, and educational facilities. It does this by connecting local units of government and school districts with pre-approved, private energy service companies (ESCOs) that evaluate the facility, identify energy-saving opportunities, and recommend a turn-key package of upgrades to be financed through the projected utility bill savings.

Streamlined state contracts

FCIP provides customers with simplified contracts designed to meet public procurement standards and to ensure that the customer is well protected. By streamlining the contract process, FCIP saves the customer costly and time-consuming legal review.

Customer representation throughout the process

The FCIP serves as the customer's advocate throughout the process. Our experienced staff provides technical, legal, and financial oversight from concept to completion.

Guaranteed performance

FCIP's pre-approved ESCO's are required to guarantee performance. If the project does not perform as guaranteed, the ESCO is responsible for fixing the problem and may be responsible for payments covering any performance shortfall.

Legislative authority (KSA 75-37,125)

FCIP is authorized by Kansas statute to promote the implementation of energy conservation improvements in public buildings by giving public entities an alternative to standard procurement methods.

The FCIP has overseen more than 60 projects statewide, resulting in over \$11 million in annual energy savings in Kansas public buildings.
