The Commission consists of three members appointed by the Governor to overlapping four-year terms. No more than two members may be of the same political party. The authority of the Kansas Corporation Commission is derived from K.S.A. 74-601 to 74-631.

The Commission regulates investor-owned utilities operating in the state, the Kansas oil and gas industry and motor carrier safety. The KCC does not regulate most electric cooperatives, water cooperatives, municipalities, wireless telephone, long distance service, cable companies, or internet services.

To carry out its multi-faceted mission, the Commission is financed from assessments, registration fees, operating charges, federal funds, and other fee funding sources. The KCC does not receive funding from the state general fund.

The financial aftermath of Winter Storm URI

Winter Storm URI will long be remembered for bitter cold temperatures, record demand for natural gas, and the resulting skyrocketing wholesale prices. The storm lasted less than two weeks, but its impact will be felt for years.

- When the storm hit, the Commission directed utilities to take necessary steps to ensure adequate amounts of natural gas and electricity in order to keep power flowing to customers and to defer the costs. That mandate helped prevent catastrophic consequences such as the loss of life that occurred in other states.
- > On March 9, 2021, the Commission opened company specific investigations to examine how each utility was prepared for the winter storm, how each responded, and how the event would impact the utility's customers. Each utility was required to present a plan to recover the costs while minimizing the impact to its customers.
- ➤ Over the past year, KCC staff has been working with utilities to verify the deferred extraordinary costs and establish recovery plans. To date, the Commission has approved seven utility recovery plans with one pending. The goal in each was to spread the costs out over time to lessen the impact to ratepayers.

Two utilities opt for securitization

The Utility Financing and Securitization Act, passed by the 2021 Legislature, provides KCC jurisdictional utilities with a new financing option to pay for energy transition costs and qualified extraordinary costs. If approved by the Commission, a utility can access special low cost financing secured by ratepayers. Since the cost savings are passed on to customers, securitization can result in substantial benefits to ratepayers.

Kansas Gas Service and Atmos Energy chose to recover their extraordinary winter weather costs using securitization. This allowed customers to pay off these costs over a longer timeframe and at lower carrying charges than traditional ratemaking and utility financing would otherwise allow.



Adequate resources expected for 2023

Kansans can rest a little easier this winter. The North American Electric Reliability Corporation (NERC) issued its Winter Reliability Report in November. It indicates the Southwest Power Pool (SPP) has adequate planning reserves for the winter season.

Kansas is part of the SPP regional transmission organization along with all or parts of Arkansas, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas, and Wyoming. It was noted 3,700 MW of natural-gas-fired generation was added to SPP resources since the winter of 2021-2022.





The Kansas Corporation Commission regulates the state's investor-owned electric companies: Evergy, Liberty-Empire, and Southern Pioneer. The KCC also has limited jurisdiction over the following: Sunflower Electric Power Corporation, Prairie Wind Transmission LLC, Midwest Energy Inc., and ITC Great Plains LLC.


The KCC regularly intervenes in electric matters at the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) to protect the interests of Kansas ratepayers. The KCC also has representation in transmission matters at the Southwest Power Pool (SPP).

Electric rates are more competitive

Improving the regional competitiveness of Kansas' electric rates is a goal shared by the Commission, the Legislature, and energy stakeholders. While the State has made great progress in the last four years, (the third largest decline in electricity rates out of all 50 states during this time), the Commission will continue to look for ways to make Kansas' electric rates more competitive, while ensuring continued access to safe, reliable electric service.

KCC staff expects to provide an update on the current status in the first few weeks of the Legislative Session, including the progress made over the past year. Here are just a few of the highlights:

- **Xansas** electricity rates declined by 2.29% over the last four years, which is the 3rd largest price decline in the country.
- **Xansas** ranks 48 out of 50 for highest growth in electricity prices during this period (No. 1 being the highest growth in prices).
- In 2021, average electricity rates in Kansas grew .91% compared to 2020. This ranks 41 out of 50 states for largest increases in prices and is the 10th lowest increase in the country.
- **\rightarrow** Kansas electricity rates are now 5.63% lower than the national average (compared to 1.8% higher than national average in 2018).



KCC works with utilities to mitigate costs

Natural gas prices are expected to increase in all regions of the U.S. this winter according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration. In the Midwest, heating a home with natural gas could cost 33% more. Heating a home using electricity could go up 8% because natural gas is often used in the generation of electricity.



Higher wholesale natural gas prices, which are deregulated, are the main driver behind the expected increases. Prices are market driven by supply and demand. Utilities pass the costs to consumers without markup or profit and all charges are verified by KCC staff audits.

In order to secure reliable and affordable service for consumers, the KCC proactively works with regulated utilities on ways to reduce the impact of volatile commodity prices by purchasing gas in advance at lower prices when possible and putting it into storage, executing hedging contracts which act as an insurance product against higher overall market prices, or purchasing gas at fixed prices for the upcoming winter.

All gas distribution utilities regulated by the KCC are required to file an annual Gas Purchase and Hedging Plan with the Commission and meet with KCC staff several times throughout the year to discuss it. While gas utilities work to control cost increases and electric utilities are able to generate a substantial portion of their electricity with low or no fuel cost generating resources, it's not possible to avoid all cost increases associated with higher wholesale energy costs, especially when such increases persist over an extended time frame such as has occurred during 2021 and 2022.

Electric vehicle charger rebates approved

As automakers move toward electric vehicles (EV), Kansas consumers have options to make the switch more affordable. On December 6, 2021, the KCC approved an agreement between its staff, the Citizens Utility Ratepayer Board (CURB) and Evergy to allow the company to offer rebates on the installation of a 240V outlet or hardwired EV charger.



There are two rebate options. Customers who elect a Time of Use (TOU) rate plan qualify for a \$500 rebate. Those not electing the TOU rate will qualify for a \$250 rebate. In addition, new Time of Use (TOU) rates will promote off-peak overnight vehicle charging at lower costs per kilowatt hour (kWh). Commercial customers are also eligible to participate.



Decision expected soon on energy efficiency program

Evergy filed an application with the Commission in December 2021 requesting approval of a portfolio of energy efficiency and demandside management programs for residential and business customers.

KCC Staff, the Citizens Utility Ratepayer Board, Evergy and other stakeholders were able to reach a unanimous settlement agreement on the programs proposed. However, KCC staff opposed the financial settlement supported by the other parties as being too costly to ratepayers. Staff worked with Evergy on a less expensive alternative for Commissioners to consider along with the original non-unanimous financial settlement. The Commission will issue an order on or before February 14, 2023.



Natural Gas and Pipeline Safety

KCC Energy Operations and Pipeline Safety staff play an important role in keeping Kansans safe in their homes and neighborhoods. They enforce federal and state pipeline safety regulations ensuring the safe operation of all gas utilities. The staff also provides technical expertise relating to electric utility operations, reliability, safety, electric transmission siting, and electric and gas consumer service, as well as analyzing requested changes to natural gas and electric certificates.

The KCC regulates three large (annual operating revenue greater than \$10 million) natural gas distribution utilities: Atmos Energy Corporation, Black Hills/ Kansas Gas Utility Co., and Kansas Gas Service, a Division of ONEOK, Inc. In addition, the Commission Staff monitors the rate and tariff activities of several interstate pipelines that serve Kansas local distribution companies, towns, and other large volume gas users.

On-Site inspections ensure best practices

Pipeline safety staff conducts on-site inspections of intrastate natural gas facilities to monitor the gas systems for any areas of noncompliance with safety regulations. A typical audit covers the operator's management of the integrity of the pipeline delivery system including a review of emergency response plans, odorization requirements, cathodic protection, leak surveys, and operator qualification requirements.

Engineers and pipeline safety inspectors also investigate any incident where natural gas is suspected to be the cause or there is an alleged violation of the Kansas Underground Utilities Damage Prevention Act (KUUDPA). Their findings are reported to the Commission.

A demonstration on Electrofusion was one of many learning opportunities offered at the Pipeline Safety Seminar held October 26.27 in Manhattan

Each year, the KCC hosts a safety seminar for pipeline operations, maintenance and emergency response professionals to update them on rules and regulations as well as offer technical demonstrations and instruction. There were 165 attendees at this year's event.

Telecommunications

KCC Telecommunications staff is responsible for administering the Kansas Universal Service Fund as well as researching, investigating, analyzing and making recommendations to the Commission on all telecommunications matters. Staff is also involved in Federal Communications Commission cases and participates on National Association of Regulatory Utility Commission (NARUC) subcommittees and Federal-State Joint Boards.

Kansas Universal Service Fund

The Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) was established by the Commission in 1996, as required by the Kansas Telecommunications Act. Now in its 26th year, the KUSF continues to provide much needed services to Kansans. Those services include telephone discounts to low-income families, phone services and adaptive equipment for persons with disabilities, and network enhancements and upgrades in rural areas.

All telecommunications companies must contribute to the KUSF. Assessments are a percentage of intrastate (within Kansas) retail revenues. Companies are allowed to pass the assessment on to its customers, but not required to. Effective March 1, 2022, the current KUSF funding requirement is \$40.4 million. The carrier assessment rate is 11.44%.

Lifeline/ACP keep Kansas families connected

Thanks to the Lifeline program, nearly 29,000 Kansans have access to telephone service allowing them to access healthcare, find jobs, stay in touch with family and call for help in an emergency. Those who qualify, based on income or participation in other assistance programs, receive up to \$17.02 per month in combined federal and state assistance. The state portion of the benefit comes from the Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF), administered by the KCC.

Anyone who qualifies for Lifeline also qualifies for the FCC's Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). It provides a service discount of up to \$30 per month for broadband service and a one-time device discount of up to \$100. More information on Lifeline and ACP is available on the KCC website.



Preparing drivers for the road ahead

The role of the KCC Transportation Division is to ensure appropriate and effective regulatory oversight of motor carriers, with the goal of protecting the public interest and promoting safety through comprehensive planning, licensing, education, and inspection. Transportation Staff conducts both comprehensive and focused off-site investigations and audits on new and existing motor carriers, taking appropriate action upon discovering unsafe conditions. The staff works closely with the Kansas Highway Patrol and the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration to reduce crashes involving motor carriers through promotion of safety education.

Education creates the foundation for safe travel

Educating motor carriers about potential hazards they may encounter, as well as teaching ways to mitigate risk and stay up-to-date on compliance requirements, makes travel in Kansas safer for everyone.

The KCC conducts free educational safety seminars every week. The classes are designed for help new motor carriers get off to a great start and to educate out of compliance motor carriers, about current rules and regulations.

The classes are held virtually, a format that has been popular among attendees and staff alike. Without the need to travel, the Transportation Division can conduct more seminars and motor carriers have easy access from any location with the only requirement being a computer or smartphone.

Motor Carriers are notified of seminar dates at the time they apply for KCC authority. Information is also available on the KCC website and is included in various transportation association newsletters and websites.

Local assistance is never far away

Motor carriers in rural areas don't have to look far for assistance. The KCC employs a team of Special Investigators (SIs) located in assigned regions throughout the state. The SIs are involved in teaching at educational safety seminars, doing roadside inspections, and offering local assistance to motor carriers in their area. That assistance may range from answering questions in the field to conducting individual "refresher" safety programs when requested by a motor carrier.



Investigators are located in the following cities: Concordia, Colby, Garden City, Hutchinson, Parsons, Lawrence, La Crosse, Paola, Topeka and Wichita.

not trivial. All are important to

safe travel. When a violation is




found, the company has 15 days to show proof the defect has been corrected. If the deficiency poses an immediate threat to safety, out of service (OOS) violation is issued and the vehicle cannot be operated until the problem is corrected. Failure to comply with an OOS order could result in state fines up to \$5,000 and federal fines of up to \$25,000.



Public Affairs and Consumer Protection (PACP)

The KCC Office of Public Affairs and Consumer Protection (PACP) supports the core mission of the agency by educating and protecting the general public on regulatory issues. PACP staff assists Kansas utility customers when they have questions or need help in resolving a service and billing issue with a regulated utility. In addition, the staff provides information about assistance programs and encourages community involvement and input through public hearings and comment sessions on matters important to Kansans.

Community outreach plays an important role

Public input is an important part of the regulatory process. PACP plans and promotes public hearings and comment periods on issues important to Kansas ratepayers, giving them a forum to share their opinions and get more information. Rate change requests from utilities are the most common matters discussed at public hearings. However, public meetings are also held on some types of transmission line siting projects.

Public Hearings may be held virtually (offering members of the public an opportunity to be an active participant from home) or in-person. For those that prefer to watch without participating, livestreaming and recordings are available for online viewing on the KCC YouTube channel.

In addition to public hearings, the Commission offers many convenient ways for the Kansans to submit a public comment on rate cases and other dockets with comment periods – online, email, via letter or a phone call to the Public Affairs office.

Identifying needs and offering help

PACP staff is instrumental in making Kansans aware of programs and services available to help them. Explaining the protections offered by the Cold Weather Rule, phone and internet discounts offered by the Lifeline program, and making referrals to public assistance agencies are just a few examples.











Advocating for Kansas customers


Complaint Categories

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

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The Utilities Division is responsible for administering the laws and regulations applicable to jurisdictional electric, natural gas, telephone, and water utilities. The Utilities Division is comprised of four sections that are responsible for providing recommendations and advice to the Commission to promote and ensure sufficient, efficient, and safe utility services at reasonable and non-discriminatory rates to consumers.

The four sections within the Utilities Division are Accounting and Financial Analysis, Economics and Rates, Energy Operations and Pipeline Safety, and Telecommunications. These sections are responsible for the following:

- 1. The Accounting and Financial Analysis section is responsible for investigating, analyzing and making recommendations to the Commission on accounting and financial issues relating to the electric, natural gas, telecommunication, and water industries. These issues include the development of a revenue requirement for rate cases and KUSF audits as well as yearly surcharge filings. The section is also involved in Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) cases and participating in Southwest Power Pool work groups.
- 2. The Economic Policy and Rates section is responsible for investigating and making recommendations on economic issues relating to the natural gas, electric, and telecommunications industries to the Commission as well as the Kansas Legislature and other state agencies. In rate cases, this section is also responsible for evaluating the class cost of service and developing a rate design.
- 3. The Energy Operations and Pipeline Safety section provides technical expertise relating to electric utility operations, reliability, safety, electric transmission siting, and electric and gas consumer service, as well as analyzing requested changes to natural gas and electric certificates. The section has primary responsibility to ensure safe operation of all gas utilities through enforcement of federal and state pipeline safety regulations. The section also has the responsibility to ensure the safe operation of electric utilities under the provisions of K.S.A. 66-101h.
- 4. The Telecommunications section is responsible for researching, investigating, analyzing, and making recommendations on courses of action for all telecommunications matters that come before the Commission. This section is also involved in Federal Communications Commission cases and participating on NARUC subcommittees and Federal-State Joint Boards.

Major Issues for FY2022

WINTER STORM URI

- From February 7, 2021, through February 19, 2021, Kansas and many other states throughout the Midwest experienced a severe and prolonged stretch of unseasonably cold temperatures. It was below freezing for thirteen straight days, with the temperatures during most of that time in the single digits to below zero. This period of prolonged arctic weather caused record demand for natural gas and electricity. At the same time, natural gas production in Texas declined by 45% due to wellheads freezing and lost electricity (weather and or firm load shed).
- In response to these weather conditions and supply constraints, Governor Kelly issued a State of Disaster Emergency Declaration on February 14, 2021. The Commission issued an Emergency Order in Docket No. 21-GIMX-303-MIS directing jurisdictional utilities to do all things necessary and possible to ensure natural gas and electricity service continued to be provided to their customers.

Utilities were also directed to coordinate efforts and take all reasonably feasible,

lawful, and appropriate actions to ensure adequate delivery of natural gas and electricity to interconnected, nonjurisdictional utilities in Kansas.

- Utilities were directed to record extraordinary costs associated with the weather event in a regulatory asset account and then file a compliance report presenting the costs of the event and a plan to minimize the financial impacts to customers.
- Record demand for natural gas for home heating and electricity generation, amid significantly reduced supplies from falling temperatures, led to a historic increase in the wholesale market price for natural gas. Natural gas prices of \$300-\$400 per MMBtu were widely reported during the weekend of February 13-14, with prices of \$500-\$1,000 per MMBtu reported on February 15-17. During this time period, the daily Southern Star Central Gas Pipeline index reached a high of \$622.78.
- Operational flow orders (OFOs) were issued by both interstate gas pipelines and natural gas distribution companies in Kansas. Additionally, natural gas distribution utilities issued curtailment notices to customers. As a result, customers experienced periods of gas curtailment, including transportation customers and other interruptible customers.
- Record natural gas prices and demand for electricity led to record wholesale electricity prices in the SPP Integrated Market (IM). On February 15, SPP's dayahead market price reached an all-time high of \$4,274/MWh. For comparison, the average price of energy in SPP's dayahead market during 2020 was \$17.81/ MWh. These market prices were not isolated to a few pricing intervals, the average on-peak day-ahead locational marginal price in SPP's IM from February 15-19 averaged 11,280% higher than the average over the last five years for those same dates. In addition to elevated market prices in the IM, supply and demand imbalances within SPP required it to take the extraordinary step of mandating load shedding for the first time in its 80-year history. This occurred in two instances,

- 641 MW (1.5%) of load for 50 minutes on February 15, and 2,700 MW (6.5%) for a little more than three hours on February 16.
- On March 9, 2021, the Commission opened individual company-specific general investigation dockets to examine the events leading up to, and occurring during and after, Winter Storm Uri. The investigations have examined how each jurisdictional electric and natural gas utility was prepared for the cold weather event, how each responded during the event, and how the event will impact each utility's Kansas customers.
- Each jurisdictional utility in Kansas was ordered to present a plan in their individual dockets to minimize the impact of the extreme wholesale energy prices for their customers. Utilities requested to recover these costs over time periods ranging from two to twelve years, depending on the magnitude of their exposure to the event and the affordability of the plan for customers. Additionally, Kansas Gas Service and Atmos filed a request to utilize the recently enacted Utility Financing and Securitization Act, K.S.A. §§ 66-1240, et seq., in order to issue lower cost securitized bonds to finance the costs associated with Winter Storm Uri. This allowed customers to pay off these costs over a longer time frame and at lower carrying charges than traditional ratemaking and utility financing would otherwise allow.
- The Commission has approved cost recovery plans for the City of Eskridge, American Energies Gas Service, Southern Pioneer Electric Company, Evergy Kansas Central, Evergy Kansas Metro, Kansas Gas Service, Black Hills and Atmos. As of the time of this writing, Empire District Electric Company has yet to submit its cost recovery plan, although one is expected during FY2023.
- In addition to evaluating cost recovery plans for utilities affected by Winter Storm Uri, the Commission also conducted extensive investigations into the operating and financial performance of Kansas public utilities during Winter Storm Uri. These

investigations led to several operational recommendations, recommendations for improved communications during winter weather emergencies, and gas purchasing/hedging strategies designed to mitigate utility ratepayer exposure to future extreme winter weather or extreme market volatility events such as occurred during Winter Storm Uri. These recommendations are being addressed in company specific investigations, rate cases, hedging/gas purchase plan Dockets, and other tariff Dockets.

EVERGY AGREEMENT WITH ELLIOTT MANAGEMENT

- On February 28, 2020, Elliott
 Management (an asset management firm
 that manages \$40 billion in assets) and
 Evergy entered into an agreement that
 called for the creation of a new Strategic
 Review and Operating Committee
 (SROC) that would report to Evergy's
 Board to evaluate ways to increase
 Evergy's shareholder value. The SROC's
 designated role was to consider either a
 Modified Standalone Plan or a Merger
 Transaction.
- On June 18, 2020, the Commission opened a general investigation into Evergy's agreement with Elliott, in Docket No. 20-GIME-514-GIE (20-514 Docket). The Commission expressed a concern that Elliott's focus on increasing shareholder value would place Evergy's customers at risk of paying higher rates or receiving diminished service quality. The Commission also ordered Staff to review the SROC and Board materials pertaining to the Elliott engagement and the ongoing strategic review.
- On August 5, 2020, Evergy announced that its Board of Directors had approved a Modified Standalone Plan its new Sustainability Transformation Plan (STP).
- On August 13, 2020, Evergy submitted a report in 20-514 Docket addressing the questions that were required by the Commission's Order opening the general investigation, and providing information about its STP.
- On August 27, 2020, the Commission issued an Order Opening General

Investigation, in the 21-EKME-088-GIE Docket (21-088 Docket), to evaluate and investigate the STP.

- On November 11, 2020, the Commission issued an Order Establishing Procedural Schedule, including a directive that all work studies were to be conducted online due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The schedule approved by the Commission called for a set of three public workshops and formal comments filed by the intervenors in order to evaluate Evergy's STP.
- On December 3, 2020, the Commission conducted a public workshop involving the Grid Modernization Investments/
 Efforts that are part of Evergy's STP. The workshop can be viewed on YouTube at: https://youtu.be/D9r59lB15bc
- On December 21, 2020, the Commission conducted a public workshop involving the Operational Efficiencies and Related Benefits of the STP. The workshop can be viewed on YouTube at: https://youtu.be/ HfpNyBhsmZM
- On January 21, 2021, the Commission conducted a public workshop involving Evergy's Customer Experience as it relates to the STP. The workshop can be viewed at the Commission's YouTube Channel at: https://youtu.be/I4tyGg4wZas
- On April 14, 2021, Staff filed Comments on Evergy's STP and the Topics Addressed during Commission Workshops. In our comments, Staff stated that we viewed Evergy's STP as a balanced and reasonable plan that has the potential to improve Evergy's regional rate competitiveness and service reliability. Staff also suggested several refinements that Evergy should make to the STP in order to gather true public acceptance of the plan.
- On May 24, 2021, Evergy completed its fourth and final workshop before the Commission in which it responded to the comments filed by parties to this Docket. This workshop can be viewed at the Commission's YouTube channel: https://youtu.be/LH3bliz -mo

- On November 23, 2021, the Commission issued an Order directing Evergy to: 1) explain the increase in its projected capital expenditures and the impact the increased spending will have on the trajectory of rates in docket 19-KCPE-096-CPL; 2) file a quarterly report on its Board and senior management level Key Performance Indicators (KPI) in a compliance docket; and 3) annually provide a more comprehensive report tracking the granular execution level of KPI to allow the Commission to evaluate whether Evergy is executing its STP successfully and making progress toward regionally competitive rates and reliable electric service. The Commission subsequently closed this docket and established Docket No. 22-EKME-298-CPL as a Compliance Docket for STP quarterly and annual reports.

REGIONALLY COMPETITIVE ELECTRIC RATES

- In various forums, and for several years, some Kansas energy stakeholders have expressed concerns regarding the level of Kansas electric rates compared to other states in the region.
- In 2019 SB 69 was codified into law as

K.S.A. 66-1287, which required two rate studies to "provide information that may assist future legislative and regulatory efforts to craft forward looking electric policy that leads to regionally competitive electric rates and reliable electric service." The first part of the rate study was submitted to the Legislature on January 14, 2020, and the second part of the rate study was submitted on January 12, 2021. Both studies are available at the following link:

- In the years that have passed since the passage of SB-69, several of the recommendations of these rate studies have been implemented by the KCC and the Kansas Legislature. The KCC has taken direct, meaningful action in seven of the eight areas suggested by London Economics International (LEI) to improve the State's regional rate competitiveness. These actions have occurred in the areas of management of utility capital expenditures, economic development rates, investments in energy efficiency, securitized ratepayerbacked bonds, SPP participation; and, review of tax rates. The seventh area. the establishment of Performance Based Ratemaking (PBR), had already been implemented as part of Evergy's Earnings Review and Sharing Plan (ERSP), with a more comprehensive review of PBR still under evaluation and expected to be completed in early 2023. Specifically, the KCC has taken the following concrete actions since the passage of SB-69:
 - The KCC Staff filed supportive testimony, and was directly involved in negotiating the final language of the bill that became K.S.A. 66-1239, which eliminated the Kansas state income tax on public utilities. Subsequently, during FY2021, the Commission processed rate reduction cases or riders to pass through the cost savings associated with these tax reductions to ratepayers in a timely fashion.
 - The KCC Staff was directly involved in drafting and negotiating the final

language of the Utility Financing and Securitization Act, K.S.A. §§ 66-1240, et seq., which will enable the low cost financing of the remaining book value of any retired electric generating assets that may be retired in the future (and which has already been used to finance extraordinary costs associated with Winter Storm Uri).

- The KCC conducted an extensive investigation into Elliott management's involvement in the affairs of Evergy, the State's largest electric utility. This investigation involved a series of intensive public workshops in which senior managers of Evergy were questioned by intervenors, ratepayer advocates, Commission Staff, and Commissioners. Once the investigation had concluded, the Commission issued an Order on November 23, 2021, requiring detailed ongoing reporting and accountability to the public pertaining to Evergy's capital expenditure projections and progress towards regionally competitive rates. The advocacy group Kansans for Lower Electric Rates (KLER) called this order a "ratepayer friendly order" and labeled it "good news."
- The KCC implemented new Economic Development Tariffs for Evergy Kansas Central and Evergy Kansas Metro, allowed pursuant to K.S.A. 66-101j. These tariffs were implemented in Docket No. 21-EKCE-318-TAR.
- The Commission has dedicated substantial time and internal resources to participation in the Southwest Power Pool (SPP) affairs, including hiring a previous KCC Commissioner, Shari Feist Albrecht, to act as the Commission's SPP Working Group Consultant, and Cost Allocation Working Group representative. Additionally, Commissioner Andrew French is one of ten Commissioners nationwide to be selected to serve on the Joint Federal-State Task Force on Electric Transmission.
- The Commission implemented a new Integrated Resource Planning

- (IRP) process for Evergy, the State's largest electric utility, in Docket No. 19-KCPE-096-CPL. This IRP process also includes a Capital Plan Filing requirement, which provides transparency and public accountability to Evergy's capital expenditure plans.
- The Commission engaged Wichita State University to conduct focus groups to determine the level of knowledge and interest in residential energy efficiency in Kansas. This information was used in Staff's evaluation of Evergy's Energy Efficiency filing, currently pending before the Commission in Docket No. 22-EKME-254-TAR. If designed prudently and efficiently, energy efficiency and demand response programs have the ability to save customers money and reduce overall utility costs.
- During the 2021 Legislative session, several Kansas energy stakeholders (Kansas Industrial Consumers Group, KLER, Citizens' Utility Ratepayer Board, Kansas Municipal Utilities, Kansas Electric Power Cooperative, and Evergy) were able to collaborate and agree on a process to monitor Kansas' electric rates for regional competitiveness. This agreement was reached on March 11, 2021, which called for Staff of the KCC to present a report to the Senate Utilities Committee during the first few weeks of the 2022 through 2024 Legislative Sessions. The states of Kansas, Colorado, Missouri, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Iowa, Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Texas were agreed to be the metric by which regional rate competitiveness would be measured, and the following information was to be reported:
 - All of the data will be sourced from the Energy Information Administration (EIA). Specifically, Tables 6, 7, and 8—released around October of every year for the previous year's data.
 - The regional electricity rate comparison would consist of the following: average residential, industrial, and commercial electricity

- rate for each Investor Owned Utility operating in these states, as reported by the EIA.
- The average monthly electric bill for residential customers for each Investor Owned Utility operating in these states, as reported by the EIA.
- The statewide average electricity rate for cooperative utilities in each of the states, presented for residential, commercial, and industrial customers as reported by the EIA.
- The statewide average electricity rate for municipal utilities in each of the states, presented for residential, commercial, and industrial customers are reported by the EIA.
- The statewide average electricity rate for all consumers across all utility types for each state.

- Staff expects to provide an update on this information in the first few weeks of the Legislative Session again, but here are some highlights from this year's report.
 - Over the last four years, Kansas electricity rates declined by 2.29%, which is the 3rd largest price decline in the country. Kansas ranks 48 out of 50 for highest growth in electricity prices during this period (No. 1 being the highest growth in prices).
 - In 2021, average electricity rates in Kansas grew .91% compared to 2020. This ranks 41 out of 50 states for largest increases in prices, which is the 10th lowest increase in the country.
 - Kansas electricity rates are now 5.63% lower than the national average

(compared to 1.8% higher than national average in 2018).

- It is no longer accurate to say that Kansas has the "highest electricity rates in the region." Kansas now has lower electricity rates than Colorado, and Minnesota, and we are just .38% higher than South Dakota.
- The Average Peer State rates from 2018 to 2021 grew similar to the U.S. Average at 5.43% vs. 5.41% nationally. Average Kansas rates declined 2.29% during this period.
- The Average Peer State rates from 2020 to 2021 grew faster than the U.S. Average at 5.59% vs. 4.82% nationally. Average Kansas rates grew .91% last year.
- Kansas' all-in average electric rate improved from 16.99% greater than the Average Peer State rate in 2018 to 8.61% greater than the Average Peer State rate in 2021, which means that Kansas electric rates have reduced the gap between us and our regional neighbors by 49.32% in just four years.
- The Commission supports the shared goal of improving the regional competitiveness of Kansas' electric rates over time, where our legal authority allows. While the State has made great progress in improving regional rate competitiveness in the last four years, (the third largest decline in electricity rates out of all 50 states during this time), the Commission will continue to look for ways to make Kansas' electric rates more competitive, while ensuring that Kansans continue to have access to safe, reliable electric service.

SIGNIFICANT INCREASES IN CAPITAL INVESTMENT

• In recent years the momentum to decarbonize the electric generation sector in the United States has accelerated dramatically, with 35 Edison Electric Institute members having adopted a netzero carbon emissions target by 2050. This movement has been driven by both environmental concerns about greenhouse gasses emitted by fossil-fueled generation sources as well as the significant decline

- in the all-in cost of energy production from renewable generation sources. In addition, many major banks, investment firms, and rating agencies have adopted policies designed to limit their exposure to risk associated with utilities that have coal-fired generation. This movement has the potential to drive significant capital investment to replace existing generation assets much sooner than the current net-zero carbon emissions target date of 2050. The timing of any retirement of existing generation, what generation technology will be used to replace any retired assets, and the ultimate rate impact of these decisions is undetermined at this time. These decisions, when made, are expected to be evaluated in Integrated Resource Planning (IRP) Dockets or Predetermination proceedings filed with the Commission pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1239.
- Another issue becoming prevalent in the electric utility industry is hardening, and in some case replacing, the aging distribution network of electric utilities to improve both reliability and resiliency and to set the stage for what many view is the coming surge in electric vehicle adoption. The aging distribution network of the Kansas-jurisdictional electric utilities is an issue that has long been discussed at the Commission, and this issue is likely to be a major driver of additional capital investment in Kansas in years to come.
- The Southwest Power Pool continues to approve new transmission facilities to enhance reliability of the transmission system. The potential new investments in transmission assets are capital intensive and will continue to place upward pressure on utility rates to the extent corresponding reductions in fuel and purchased power do not offset these increases. While Evergy Kansas Central and Evergy Kansas Metro are under a base rate moratorium through January of 2024 as a result of the Commissionapproved merger in Docket No. 18-KCPE-095-MER, transmission costs for these utilities will continue to be passed through to retail customers with changes in each utility's actual transmission costs, in accordance with K.S.A. 66-1237.
- Investor-owned natural gas distribution utilities in Kansas are facing aging infrastructure, some of which is constructed of materials that are considered to be obsolete or that present a safety risk. This has led to these gas utilities placing an increased emphasis on accelerating the rate of replacement of aging infrastructure. This effort has also increased capital expenditures levels and led to more frequent general rate cases. Senate Bill 279 took effect January 1, 2019, and amended K.S.A. 66-2202, 66-2203, and 66-2204. This bill expanded the definition of eligible capital investments that are recoverable through the Gas System Reliability Surcharge (GSRS) and doubled the size limitations previously in effect for the GSRS. With these revisions. Gas utilities in the state will be able to file for Commission approval of an annual cost recovery mechanism to recover up to \$.80 per month, per residential customer, in new revenues each year. This surcharge may recover up to 20% of a company's currently approved base revenue level. The surcharge may only be in effect for five years (with an additional year extension available upon Commission approval) until a rate case must be filed in order for the utility to regain eligibility to file for a new GSRS surcharge.
- Telecommunications companies are continuing to invest in new technologies, primarily to enhance broadband services. The investment in broadband services is generally driven by the FCC's National Broadband Plan, which has a goal of supporting the provision of broadband communications in areas that would be unserved or underserved without such support. However, the continued investment in new technologies should not increase the size of the KUSF. The 2013 Kansas Legislature passed House Bill 2201, which modified K.S.A. 66-2008. K.S.A. 66-2008, as revised, caps the KUSF at \$30 million for rate of return regulated carriers, caps support for price cap regulated carriers, eliminates KUSF support for electing carriers, and phased out KUSF support for competitive eligible telecommunications carriers.

Electric

OVERVIEW

The KCC regulates nine large (annual operating revenue greater than \$10 million) electric utilities. A list of the large electric utilities and a brief overview of the major activities for FY2022 are noted below. A summary of each major docket associated with the companies follows this narrative section along with a listing of all other electric dockets. Also included in this narrative section is a discussion of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) activity and transmission issues that the Utilities Division spent a significant amount of time on during FY2022.

LARGE ELECTRIC UTILITY COMPANIES

Empire District Electric Company

Evergy Metro (formerly Kansas City Power & Light Company)

Southern Pioneer Electric Company

Sunflower Electric Power Corporation (Limited per K.S.A. 66-104d)

Evergy Kansas Central (formerly Westar Energy Inc.)

Wheatland Electric Cooperative, Inc.

Prairie Wind Transmission, LLC (Transmission Only)

Midwest Energy, Inc. (Limited per K.S.A. 66-104d)

ITC Great Plains, LLC (Transmission Only)

There were no major rate cases filed in FY2022, however there was one rate case from FY2021 that was decided.

Empire District Electric Company filed Docket No. 21-EPDE-444-RTS on May 28, 2021. This was an abbreviated rate case approved in Docket No. 19-EPDE-223-RTS, and was limited to the following: (1) recovering the capital and operating costs relating to its acquisition of three wind projects; (2) accounting for

the retirement of its Asbury coal fired generating plant; and (3) capturing the revenue requirement impact directly related to the non-growth plant and related accumulated depreciation and accumulated deferred income tax balances as of the end of the test year ending June 30, 2020.

Empire's Application indicated a gross revenue deficiency of \$4,465,956. Alternatively, Empire has proposed a fixed-price PPA-type approach to recover its wind projects. Staff and Intervenor testimony was filed on January 14, 2022. Staff recommended an overall rate reduction of \$2,833,863 for Empire. A settlement was reached where the parties agreed to litigate the inclusion of Empire's requested Wind Projects in rate base, while agreeing to settle all other issues in the rate case for a revenue requirement reduction of \$636,091. After an Evidentiary Hearing on March 8-9, 2022, Empire filed a request to withdraw its Application without prejudice, which would allow Empire to request inclusion of the Wind Projects in rates at a later date. The Commission granted Empire's motion to withdraw on May 26, 2022, and approved the Settlement Agreement which lowered Empire's rates by \$636,091.

In addition, there was a Winter Storm Uri Cost Recovery Docket filed by Evergy Kansas Central and Evergy Kansas Metro in Docket No. 21-EKME-329-GIE. The details of that filing, and the end result is discussed in detail in the Docket Narrative section.

Lastly, there was a major Docket filed during FY2022 involving NextEra Transmission Southwest LLC (NEET-SW), Docket No. 22-NETE-419-COC. This involved a request for a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity to Construct Transmission Facilities in the State of Kansas. In this Docket, NEET-SW applied for a Certificate of Convenience to operate in Kansas as public utility for the purpose of constructing and operating approximately 100 miles of 345kV electric transmission line. NEET-SW

contended the transmission line was necessary based on studies completed by the SPP that demonstrated a local reliability need, as well as regional economic benefits in the form of reduced wholesale energy costs and transmission congestion, from the facility. Based on the evidence presented by all parties that participated in the Docket, the Commission approved a settlement agreement that concluded the proposed project was necessary and beneficial to the State of Kansas. Accordingly, the Commission issued NEET-SW a transmission rights only certificate for the proposed line. The Commission also required additional studies to be completed by NEET-SW to determine the viability of double circuiting approximately 25 miles of the line as a prerequisite to filing an application with the Commission to site the route of the proposed line. Additional details and links to the proceeding are contained in the Docket Narrative section.

FEDERAL ISSUES

The KCC intervened in several electric matters at the FERC during FY2022.

FERC Rulemaking Dockets:

• RM18-9 – FERC's final ruling (Order 2222) on the participation on distributed energy resource aggregation in wholesale markets. Distributed energy resources (DER) are any resource located on the distribution system or behind the meter. DER is a broad definition that can include decentralized, modular, and more flexible technologies. These systems provide energy, capacity and other ancillary services. Order 2222 was issued on September 17, 2020, and it removed barriers to the participation of DER aggregations in the capacity, energy, and ancillary service markets operated by **Regional Transmission Organizations** (e.g., the Southwest Power Pool or SPP). RTO/ISOs must amend their tariffs to allow DER aggregators to participate in their markets. RTOs have until spring 2022 to implement the changes required in Order 2222. The Commission has intervened in this docket at FERC and submitted comments, largely focusing

on the need to respect principles of cooperative federalism and state jurisdiction. Staff is actively participating in the stakeholder process at SPP.

Currently, there is one company, Voltus, in Kansas operating as a DER. On December 22, 2021, Voltus petitioned FERC for a technical conference on Order 2222 compliance, which remains pending before FERC.

- RM20-10 FERC's notice of proposed rulemaking (NOPR) regarding potential revision to its transmission incentives policy. The KCC intervened and provided comments addressing elements of the NOPR that it believes would produce unjust and unreasonable rates. Generally, the KCC takes issue with types of incentives that add basis points to public utility and independent system operator's ROEs. On April 15 2021, FERC issued a Supplemental NOPR proposing the following revisions to the prior NOPR: (1) limiting the return on equity adder for RTO participation to three years; (2) capping the RTO Adder at 50 basis points; (3) granting the RTO Adder only where a public utility voluntarily joins a Regional Transmission Organization; and (4) barring public utilities from receiving the RTO Participation Adder for transmission plant already under the operational control of an RTO. On June 25, 2021, the KCC issued supplemental comments on the NOPR generally in support of the revisions contained in the Supplemental NOPR. However, the KCC's continues to advocate for the complete elimination of the RTO Participation Adder. This issue is pending before FERC.
- RM21-14 FERC's March 8, 2021, Notice of Inquiry on whether to revise its rules that prohibit RTOs from accepting aggregated demand response bids from retail customers of utilities that sold less than 4 million MWh. This issue is a sub-set of broader issues that were addressed in Order Nos. 841, 841-A, 2222, and 2222-A. Consistent with its prior positions in those matters, the KCC intervened and filed comments asking FERC to allow retail regulators to decide

whether aggregators can participate. This matter remains pending before FERC.

- RM21-17 FERC issued a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking on longterm scenario planning on April 21, 2022. This NOPR is a refinement to FERC's NOPR issued on July 15, 2021. identifying a broad range of issues and potential reforms regarding interregional planning and development, regional planning and development and generator interconnection processes. On August 17, 2022, Chair Keen filed comments in opposition to the proposed rules. On August 23, 2022, the KCC filed comments that reiterated the request from its prior NOPR comments for an interregional connectivity requirement and identified information FERC should elicit and additional issues FERC should consider before acting on the proposed rule. Reply comments were submitted on September 19, 2022. The matter is currently pending before FERC. Chairman Glick has expressed an interest in issuing a final rule before the end of 2022.
- RM22-14 FERC Notice of Proposed Rulemaking on issues involving generator interconnection processes, which are a subset of issues initially identified in the Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in RM21-17, which covered building for the future through transmission planning providing guidance to RTOs. The KCC has not taken any specific action in this docket. Initial comments due on October 13, 2022, and reply comments are due on November 14, 2022. FERC is likely to take action in the first half of 2023.
- AD21-15 FERC/NARUC Task Force on a broad range of transmission issues. Commissioner French sits on the Taskforce, but otherwise, the KCC has not taken any specific action in this docket. The next Taskforce meeting is scheduled for November 15, 2022, at NARUC's annual meeting.
- AD23-0 FERC's "Workshop" Docket to explore whether/how to establish a minimum requirement for interregional connectivity. The virtual workshop will

be held on December 5 and December 6, 2022. Based on past practice, FERC will issue an agenda after it selects the panelists in November of 2022.

FERC Dockets involving Kansas-Jurisdictional Utilities:

- EL19-75, EL19-77, EL17-21, ER16-1341 These dockets are multiple Section 205 and 206 filing addressing revenue credits and refunds under Attachment Z2 of the SPP OATT. The KCC filed a doc-less notice of intervention in several of these consolidated proceedings. The KCC is monitoring the proceedings and has not taken a position on the merits. On January, 14, 2022, KEPCo filed an answer asking FERC to direct SPP to expedite its processing of refunds and provide refunds by a date certain. The matter remains pending at FERC.
- EL21-18, ER22-2084 KEPCo filed a formal challenge and complaint against Evergy asserting certain costs that Evergy recovers through its Generation Formula Rate from KEPCo are unjust and unreasonable. In particular, KEPCo identified Evergy recovery of amortized costs of previously unapproved regulatory assets and cancelled investments and accounting treatment for unfunded reserves. The KCC filed a docless intervention on December 2, 2020. The KCC Staff is engaged in settlement discussions with KEPCo, Evergy, and Trial Staff on the unfunded reserves issue. The KCC did not take a position on the cost-recovery issues that were within the scope of settlement judge procedure.

The docket is currently on two tracks. On the settlement track, FERC issued an order on August 15, 2022, accepting an uncontested stipulation regarding accounting treatment of unfunded reserves. On the litigation track, FERC issued an order on October 3, 2022, (i) directing Evergy to refund costs recovered for unapproved regulatory assets, and (ii) affirming Evergy's recovery, over KEPCo's objection, of costs for canceled projects. Next steps are unclear as FERC already issued a rehearing order, which would mean KEPCo and Evergy are free to seek

judicial review. But the October 3, 2022 order resolved KEPCo's motion to compel Evergy to comply with the rehearing order, which suggests another request for rehearing may be required before parties can appeal.

• EL22-20 – KEPCo's December 10, 2021, Formal Challenge and Section 206 Complaint regarding Evergy's 2022 generation formula rate, particularly its calculation of Variable O&M expense, treatment of costs associated with the Jeffrey Energy Center, and treatment of SPP charge types. The KCC filed a doc-less notice of intervention on January 10, 2022. The KCC Staff is engaged in formal and informal settlement discussions with KEPCo and Evergy. The next settlement meeting is scheduled for November 2022.

Both KEPCo and Evergy sought rehearing of various aspects of FERC's May 31, 2022 hearing order. In an Order issued on October 6, 2022. FERC agreed with KEPCo that the refund date should have been the earlier date established in the Evergy's implementation protocols instead of the late date of the filing of the Challenge/Complaint.¹ FERC also provided Evergy its requested clarifications or dismissed its concerns as premature. Thus, this track should be resolved.

• ER22-1657 – Following the disallowance of amortized costs of unapproved regulatory assets in EL21-18, Evergy filed this Section 205 application to obtain approval of multiple regulatory assets. The KCC filed a doc-less notice of intervention on May 6, 2022. It has not taken a position on the merits.

In an October 3, 2022 order, FERC accepted the filing subject to hearing procedures. It held those procedures in abeyance pending the outcome of settlement judge procedures. Judge

McBarnette has been assigned as settlement judge. She has yet to schedule any settlement conferences.

• ER22-1205 – KEPCo's March 3, 2022, Formal Challenge to Evergy's calculation of capital structure in its generation formula rate. The KCC filed a notice of intervention and comments on April 21, 2022 that (i) agreed with KEPCo that Evergy improperly double counted some amounts from 2018 to 2022, but (ii) asked FERC to consider unique circumstances of the 1992 KPL/KGE merger and allow Evergy to include KGE's retained earnings in its calculation.

FERC issued a deficiency letter on July 29, 2022, seeking additional information from Evergy regarding the issues the KCC addressed in its ER22-1205 comments. Evergy responded on August 29, 2022, and a FERC order is due by October 28, 2022.

• ER22-1500 – SPP's March 30, 2022, Section 205 application, on behalf of Sunflower, to update the depreciation rates included in the transmission formula rate SPP recovers for Sunflower. The KCC filed a doc-less notice of intervention on April 20, 2022, and has not taken a position on the merits.

FERC set the matter for hearing in an August 8, 2022, order. It held the hearing in abeyance pending the outcome of settlement judge procedures. Judge Hessler will convene the next settlement conference on November 29, 2022.

SOUTHWEST POWER POOL

SPP is also a regulated public utility in Kansas, having obtained from the Commission a limited Certificate of Convenience and Authority to manage and coordinate use of certain transmission facilities and to develop an energy imbalance market. Simultaneously, the Commission authorized the existing electric public utilities in Kansas to transfer functional control of transmission facilities to and participate in an SPP energy imbalance market.

When SPP became an RTO, it had 131

employees and 48 members including 28 (58% of membership) investor-owned utilities, municipal systems, generation and transmission cooperatives and state authorities who served retail loads in parts of eight states (Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas). Three Nebraska public power utilities became members of SPP in 2008. On October 1, 2015, SPP membership expanded to include the Integrated Transmission System consisting of a portion of the Western Area Power Administration, Basin Electric Cooperative and the Heartland Consumers Power District. This integration, while contested by the KCC at FERC because of cost allocation concerns, added 5,000 MW of peak demand and 7,600 MW of generating capacity to SPP's system. In 2019, SPP launched the first of its Western Energy Services, Western Reliability Coordination, expanding its service territory to encompass parts of 17 states. SPP currently has around 650 employees and 113 members directly or indirectly responsible for serving 19 million people in the 17 states, 552,000-square-mile region, including more than 70,000 miles of high-voltage transmission lines.

Commission interaction with the SPP and participation in RTO matters is authorized by K.S.A. 74-633 and K.S.A. 66-106. The SPP organization has created approximately thirty primary working groups/committees, as well as multiple subordinate task forces. The Commission is represented by one KCC Commissioner on the Regional State Committee (RSC), which consists of one regulator or other state representative from each of the load-serving states in the SPP. The Cost Allocation Working Group reports to the RSC and is composed of one voting staff member from each of the states, along with other state staff participants. The RSC fulfills an advisory role in SPP and does not "approve" any transmission projects. Its participation in the SPP process is mostly limited to providing collective state regulatory agency input and participation, as stated in the RSC

¹ Because FERC did not act on KEPCo's rehearing request within the time prescribed by the Federal Power Act, KEPCo filed a protective petition for review with the D.C. Circuit on September 28, 2022. D.C. Circuit Case No. 22-1254. The October 6, 2022 order should render that petition moot.

By-Laws. However, the RSC does have specific authority over specific areas within SPP including cost allocation methodologies. For example, the RSC designed the original cost allocation methodology for committing retail ratepayer funds for construction of new transmission projects and has revised the methodology from time to time. The RSC has no responsibility in approving transmission projects or their associated costs. Approval of specific transmission projects and their associated costs are ultimately approved for construction by the SPP Board of Directors. Thus, the KCC has no direct oversight through its SPP involvement over the amount of spending for Kansas-specific or regional transmission projects, which makes it imperative that the Commission be represented in a liaison capacity on multiple SPP stakeholder committees and task forces.

Kansas also participated directly in SPP's Improved Resource Availability Task Force (IRATF). The IRATF was formed as a result of SPP's 2021 February Winter Weather Event Report. The Winter Weather Report identified four Tier 1 recommendations for immediate action that were assigned to the IRATF. The Tier 1 recommendations fall under fuel assurance and resource planning and availability. For fuel assurance, the report identified; (1) the development of policies that enhance fuel assurance to improve the availability and reliability of generation in the SPP region, and (2) the evaluation and, as applicable, advocacy for improvements in gas industry policies, including use of gas price cap mechanisms, needed to assure gas supply is readily and affordably available during extreme events. For resource planning and availability, the report identified; (1) perform initial and ongoing assessments of minimum reliability attributes needed from SPP's resource mix, and (2) improve or develop policies, which may include required performance of seasonal resource adequacy assessments, development of accreditation criteria, incorporation of minimum reliability attribute requirements, and utilization

of market-based incentives that ensure sufficient resources will be available during normal and extreme conditions. The IRATF's work in ongoin.

TRANSMISSION PLANNING AND CONSTRUCTION

Since its inception as an RTO, the SPP has added more than \$8.3 billion in new transmission projects.

The total ATRR for region-wide transmission projects is \$558 million as of November 2022. This represents annual capital cost recovery, operation and maintenance (O&M), and other transmission related expenses for regional projects that are in-service. These revenue requirements are recovered through FERC-approved Transmission Formula Rates (TFR), FERC-approved stated rates, or, in some cases, state approved TFRs. The current annual cost to Kansas ratepayers is approximately 17% of the annual transmission revenue requirement for the region, or \$95 million. The amount of expected transmission investment is currently expected to grow by approximately \$1.8 billion for the entire SPP footprint in the next three years as new SPP-approved projects come in to service. These projects are expected to come into service during the years 2023 through 2025, with relatively few new transmission projects currently expected after that timeframe.

Grain Belt Express

Clean Line Energy Partners (Clean Line) was certificated as a public utility by the Commission in December 2011. Clean Line subsequently filed a line siting application for the Grain Belt Express Clean Line Project and this project was approved by the Commission on November 7, 2013. On November 9, 2018, Clean Line entered into a purchase agreement to sell the Grain Belt Express assets to Invenergy Transmission LLC. The assets primarily consist of a proposed ± 600 kilo-volt (kV), high voltage direct current (HVDC) transmission line along with associated facilities capable of delivering 4,000 megawatts (MW) of power from Kansas

to load centers east of Kansas. The project will originate in western Kansas near Sunflower's Spearville substation and traverse east across the state (approximately 370 miles) into Missouri where it will interconnect in the MISO RTO market at the St. Francis substation in southeastern Missouri. From there, the line will continue into Indiana where it will interconnect with the PJM RTO market at the Sullivan substation. The Project has been estimated to cost \$2.2 billion. This project will be funded through the sales of transmission capacity to wholesale customers (referred to as merchant transmission) and, therefore, will not be funded by Kansas retail ratepayers.

The project was approved by Indiana, Missouri, and Kansas. The Certificate it had received from the Illinois Commerce Commission was reversed upon appeal. After a July 2018 court ruling in Missouri, the decision of issuing a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity was remanded to the Missouri Public Service Commission (MPSC) for additional review. On March 20, 2019, the MPSC granted the Grain Belt Express a Certificate of Convenience and Necessity. On December 28, 2018, Invenergy Transmission LLC and Clean Line filed and Application seeking approval of Invenergy purchasing the Kansas assets of Clean Line. On June 18, 2019, issued an order approving the transaction with certain conditions The Kansas docket approving the siting of the proposed transmission line required the Grain Belt Express to begin construction in Kansas by November of 2018. In an October 4, 2018, Order issued in Docket 13-GBEE-803-MIS (13-803 Docket), the Commission extended the sunset term of the siting approval to March 1, 2019, conditioned upon Grain Belt submitting evidence of its financial, managerial and technical ability to complete the Project. Some of the conditions contained in the settlement agreement that was approved as part of the sale of the Grain Belt assets to Invenergy are related to the sunset provisions contained in the 13-803 Docket. On September 26, 2019,

the Commission replaced the 13-803 sunset provisions with requirements for Invenergy to meet specific deadlines to obtain easements in Kansas for the new line. Failure to meet the deadlines will subject Invenergy to financial penalties.

Natural Gas

OVERVIEW

The KCC regulates three large (annual operating revenue greater than \$10 million) natural gas distribution utilities. A list of the large gas distribution utilities and a brief overview of the major activities for FY2022 are noted below. A summary of each major docket associated with the companies follows this narrative section along with a listing of all other natural gas dockets. Also included in this narrative section is a discussion of the Federal issues that the Utilities Division spent a significant amount of time on during FY2022.

LARGE GAS UTILITY COMPANIES

ATMOS Energy Corporation Black Hills/Kansas Gas Utility Co.

Kansas Gas Service, a Division of ONEOK, Inc.

During FY2022 there were no new rate cases filed involving major natural gas companies, however one rate case was completed.

On August 28, 2020, in Docket No. 21-BHCG-099-RTS, Black Hills filed to reflect its recent exemption from Kansas State Income Taxes, pursuant to HB 2585. Black Hills reduced its base rates by \$558,416 and its GSRS rates by \$159,037.

On August 28, 2020, Kansas Gas Service filed Docket No. 21-KGSG-097-RTS to reduce its Kansas rates to reflect its recent exemption from Kansas State Income Taxes pursuant to HB 2585. KGS' rates were reduced by \$4,874,974 as a result of this filing.

On May 7, 2021, Black Hills Energy filed Docket No. 21-BHCG-418-RTS, seeking an increase in its base rates of \$2.5 million. The company cited the following reasons for filing the case: (1) the requirement to file

a full rate case in order to continue using the Gas System Reliability Surcharge; (2) general cost increases since the last rate case; (3) additional investment in gas plant, property and equipment; (4) increases in wages, medical expenses, materials and supplier costs; (5) new depreciation rates for Black Hills' general plant; and (6) a request for the creation of a Tax Adjustment Rider in order to refund excess deferred income taxes.

On October 8, 2021, the parties to this Docket presented a settlement agreement calling for no change in base rates, and a provision to refund \$3,024,315 in rate refunds each year for the next three years.

On December 30, 2021, the Commission issued its Order Approving Unanimous Settlement Agreement without modification. Additional information about this rate case, including links to the Settlement Agreement and Commission Order can be found in the Docket Narrative section of the Report below.

In addition, there were Winter Storm Uri Cost Recovery Dockets filed by Atmos Energy (21-ATMG-333-GIG), Black Hills Energy (21-BHCG-334-GIG), and Kansas Gas Service (21-KGSG-332-GIG). Additionally, Kansas Gas Service (22-KGSG-466-TAR) and Atmos Energy (22-ATMG-538-TAR) filed Applications seeking permission to issue Securitized Ratepayer Backed Bonds to finance the extraordinary costs associated with Winter Storm Uri. The details of all these filings, and the end results are discussed in detail in the Docket Narrative section below.

FEDERAL ISSUES

The Commission Staff monitors the rate and tariff activities of several interstate pipelines that serve Kansas local distribution companies, towns, and other large volume gas users. Chief among these is Southern Star Central, which transports 60% to 70% of all natural gas consumed annually in Kansas. Other interstate gas pipelines such as Kansas Pipeline Company, Cheyenne Plains Gas Transmission, Panhandle Eastern Pipeline, Tallgrass Interstate Gas Pipeline, and Northern Natural Gas are

also monitored.

In addition to monitoring rate and tariff issues, the KCC intervenes in a variety of other filings by interstate gas transmission companies including: annual fuel and lost and unaccounted for gas filings (FL&U), construction and abandonment filings, tariff change filings, gas quality specifications filings, and storage dockets. The KCC also participates rulemaking and policy dockets that affect the cost of gas transportation.

During FY2022, the KCC intervened in the following Natural Gas Dockets at FERC:

• RP21-778 - Southern Star Section 4 Rate Case – On April 30, 2021, Southern Star filed a Section 4 General Rate Case at FERC requesting an annual increase in revenues of \$170 million from its natural gas transportation and storage customers. In its Application, Southern Star requested a cost of service of \$411.7 million, supported by a rate of return of 11.46% (actual capital structure 31.7/68.2 debt to equity and a return on equity of 14.60%). In addition, Southern Star sought to establish a \$528 million pipeline modernization program over a six-year period. Under the program, Southern Star would invest up to \$88 million per year to modernize its pipeline infrastructure, which would be billed through a cost-recovery mechanism (CRM) surcharge. The CRM Surcharge would remain effect from March 1, 2023 through February 28, 2029. The KCC intervened in the rate case and committed considerable Staff resources to perform a cost of service audit and participate in settlement negotiations during 2021 and 2022.

On March 1, 2022, Southern Star filed a Stipulation and Agreement that included black box settlement rates, providing Southern Star a cost of service of \$334.1 million per year, which represents a 24.2% increase over its existing revenues generated from the its base rates and modernization surcharge. Based on the KCC analysis, the Stipulation and Agreement included an overall rate of

return of 9.44%, based on a hypothetical capital structure of 40/60 debt to equity and a return on equity of 12.60%. The Stipulation and Agreement included a five-year rate moratorium and approved a Modernization Program that allows Southern Star to invest \$238 million (\$88 million in the first year with \$50 million annually over for the next three years). The KCC signed on as a signatory to the Stipulation and Agreement, and FERC issued an Order and Opinion approving the Settlement Agreement on May 25, 2022.

• RP22-1033 – Northern Natural Gas Rate Case – On June 16, 2022, Northern Natural Gas provided notice of customer meeting to discuss its Section 4 rate case filing, which was filed on July 1, 2022. Northern's last Section 4 rate case was filed July 1, 2019, in FERC Docket RP19-1353 and was settled on September 28, 2020. The Stipulation and Agreement in the RP19-1353 rate case included a 28% increase in Northern's rates and included a rate moratorium that ended June 30, 2022.

In its filing, Northern stated its rate case is driven by an investment of \$1.6 billion in pipeline modernization and maintenance capital that is not in rates, adding approximately \$1.1 billion to rate base or a 37% increase from its last rate case. Northern's rate case includes a cost of service of \$1.34 billion or an increase of \$477.9 million, which equates to a 55.6% increase over its existing cost of service of \$860 million. Northern's requested rate of return is 10.61%, which includes an ROE of 14.31% and a capital structure is 36.4% debt and 63.6% equity.

On July 13, 2022, the KCC submitted its Notice of Intervention, Protest, and Request for the Maximum Suspension period available under the Natural Gas Act for the RP22-1033 rate proceeding. KCC Staff is actively participating in the review of Northern's rate case filing and future settlement negotiations.

Natural Gas Pipeline Safety

OVERVIEW

Pipeline safety personnel continue to conduct onsite inspections of intrastate natural gas facilities. The inspections monitor the gas systems for any areas of non-compliance with pipeline safety regulations. A typical audit will stress compliance with the operator's management of the integrity of the pipeline delivery system including such topics as review of emergency response plans, odorization requirements, cathodic protection, leak surveys, and operator qualification requirements. In addition, engineers and pipeline safety inspectors investigate any incident suspected of being caused by natural gas and report these to the Commission. Any recommendations of Staff regarding prevention of potential incidents are included in the report and considered by the Commission. Statistics that provide a snapshot of the pipeline safety personnel's inspection activity, as well as an overview of the regulated gas infrastructure in Kansas, can be found in the pipeline safety section of this report.

Pipeline safety personnel also investigate violations of the Kansas Underground **Utilities Damage Prevention Act** (KUUDPA). Investigators work with excavators and utility operators to assure compliance with provisions of the Act such as requesting locates prior to digging and locating facilities within 48 hours of being notified of pending excavation work. To enhance our KUUDPA enforcement efforts, KCC receives two federal grants that provide funding for two inspector positions for the calendar year. For the calendar year of 2021, the Commission acted upon 13 filings in which fines were levied to 9 excavators for failure to notify utilities prior to excavating over buried facilities. Fines were also levied to 4 utility operators for failure to provide timely or accurate locates. For the 13 cases, a total of \$9,500 in fines was levied.

Kansas experienced no natural gas incidents in FY2022.

Liquid Pipeline Common Carriers

OVERVIEW

Although there are relatively few intrastate pipeline common carriers in Kansas, the Commission is responsible for the economic regulation of this sector. The majority of Staff's work in this area is the review of tariff and rate filings in an effort to ensure efficiency, public interest, and balanced benefit to Kansas common carriers and shippers. Staff is responsible for the economic regulation, including but not limited to: processing tariff and rate filings; analyzing tariffs for compliance; monitoring complaints; processing and monitoring certificate filings due to sales, purchases, mergers and acquisitions, divestitures, service cessations and abandonment; and monitoring operations for unforeseeable events and capacity constraints. Additionally, Staff tracks all intrastate revenue reported from each pipeline company. Staff processed 15 intrastate pipeline common carrier dockets during FY2022. The intrastate liquid pipeline companies regulated by the KCC are noted below. There were no major dockets in FY2022 for liquid pipelines. A listing of all other liquid pipeline dockets follow this narrative section.

Telecommunications

OVERVIEW

The KCC regulates four primary types of telecommunications carriers with varying degrees of regulation: **Incumbent Local Exchange Carriers** (ILECs); Electing Carriers; Competitive Local Exchange Carriers (CLECs); and Interexchange Carriers (IXCs) (also known as long-distance carriers). These telecommunications carriers serve a customer base ranging from as few as one customer to over 250,000 customers. The large telecommunications carriers regulated by the KCC are noted below. A summary of each major docket associated with the telecommunications carriers follow this narrative section along with a listing of all other telecommunications dockets.

LARGE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CARRIERS

Including the five large telecommunications utilities listed above, the Commission has certificated 36 incumbent local exchange carriers (ILECs), 123 CLECs, and 193 IXCs.

The KCC continues its effort in fulfilling its obligation to protect the rights and privileges of Kansas consumers in balance with the interests of the telecommunication carriers. The evolution of competition in providing local and long distance telecommunications has resulted, in some instances, in greater choice of available services at a variety of rates with a wider array of providers, packages, and bundles from which to choose. Technology developments have also continued to play a key role in the evolution of the telecommunications industry.

The KCC Staff is responsible for economic regulation, including but not limited to: processing incumbent local exchange carrier tariff filings and switched access rate filings; analyzing tariffs for compliance with KCC rules and regulations; administering consumer and carrier complaints; processing certificate filings, service cessations, name changes, and sales and acquisitions involving rural ILECs; reviewing carrierto-carrier interconnection agreements and providing mediation when necessary; ensuring quality services of the incumbent local exchange carriers; overseeing the Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF); auditing rate-of-return regulated ILECs; processing video service applications; and processing eligible telecommunications carriers filings.

KANSAS UNIVERSAL SERVICE FUND

The KUSF was established by the Commission in 1996, as required by the Kansas Telecommunications Act. The KUSF is in its twenty-seventh year of providing support to local telephone service providers to assist in making universal service available in high-cost areas of the state, to provide dual-party relay service and telecommunications equipment for persons with disabilities, and to provide assistance to those with lower incomes through the Lifeline program. Effective March 1, 2022, the annual KUSF funding requirement is approximately \$40.4 million and the carrier assessment rate is 11.44%. The KUSF provides approximately \$39.1 million in high-cost support, \$241,500 for low-income subscribers, \$304,700 for telecommunications relay service, \$270,800 for the telecommunications equipment program, and \$515,600 for the fund administration and carrier audits.

The Commission began audits of all ILECs receiving KUSF support in 2000. The Commission has completed the initial audits for all ILECs and continues to monitor and initiate new audits when warranted based on an annual review of financial metrics. All of the rural ILECs have elected rate-of-return

regulation; therefore, the audits provide an opportunity for the Commission to determine whether or not the KUSF support is cost-based for each rural ILEC.

On August 12, 2021, Craw-Kan Telephone Cooperative, Inc. (Craw-Kan) filed an Application requesting an additional \$5.5 million of annual KUSF support. On August 31, 2021, the Commission issued a Procedural Schedule Order. Commission Staff's Direct Testimony supported an annual increase of \$2,130,291 in Craw-Kan's KUSF support and, through Rebuttal Testimony, Craw-Kan supported an annual increase of \$2,393,881. On January 12, 2022, Staff and Craw-Kan filed a Settlement Agreement in which Craw-Kan's annual KUSF support would increase \$2,397,716 annually, prior to any pro-rating of the KUSF support. The Commission approved the Settlement Agreement on April 7, 2022.

On June 2, 2022, Columbus
Communications Services, LLC
(Columbus) filed an Application
requesting \$474,950 of annual
KUSF support. On June 23, 2022,
the Commission issued a Procedural
Schedule Order. On October 6, 2022,
Commission Staff's Direct Testimony
supported Columbus' receipt of \$403,007
of annual KUSF support, prior to any
pro-rating of KUSF support. Columbus'
Rebuttal Testimony is due to be filed
October 26, 2022. A Commission Order
is due January 30, 2023.

K.S.A. 66-2008(e)(3) caps the annual KUSF support payable to the rural ILECs at \$30 million. When the Commission approves a change to a rural ILEC's KUSF support, the amount is prior to any pro-rata calculations Staff makes to determine each rural ILEC's share of the \$30 million support cap. Staff files its pro-rata KUSF support calculation for the rural ILECs in the annual KUSF docket to ensure the rural ILECs can review those calculations. The Commission issues an order setting the rural ILECs' pro-rated KUSF support. This process occurs whenever a change in a rural ILEC's KUSF support is approved.

On May 14, 2021, a coalition of Rural Local Exchange Carriers (RLECs) appealed the Commission's Orders implementing legislatively mandated pro-rata reductions to the Rural Local Exchange Carriers' (RLECs) Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) subsidies for exceeding the \$30 million statutory cap on annual KUSF payments to the RLECs. Following Oral Argument, on April 29, 2022, the District Court of Shawnee County issued its Memorandum Decision and Order, denying the RLECs' Petition for Judicial Review. On May 22, 2022, the RLECs filed their notice of appeal to the Court of Appeals. In the RLECs' docketing statement filed July 22, 2022, they claim, "In 2013, the legislature, without explanation, broke its promise and instituted a \$30,000,000 cap on the amount of cumulative high cost support to be paid to RLECs."

On October 11, 2022, the RLECs filed their Brief with the Court of Appeals, reiterating their arguments that a legislatively imposed statutory cap is an illegal takings under the 5th Amendment of U.S. Constitution and violates other statutory provisions, and thus should be repealed. The RLECs are essentially challenging the legislature's authority to impose any constraints on the annual Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) subsidies they receive. The Commission's Brief is currently due November 10, 2022, and the RLECs would then have 14 days to file a reply brief. We expect the Court to schedule oral argument following the briefing. There is no statutory deadline for the Court to issue its opinion.

FEDERAL ISSUES

Congress determined that broadband is no longer a luxury but a necessity for full participation in our economy and society – for all Americans. For that reason, the FCC adopted comprehensive reforms of its Universal Service Fund (USF) and Intercarrier Compensation (ICC) systems to accelerate broadband build-out to the approximately 23 million Americans (as of December 31, 2013) who lacked access to infrastructure capable of providing

10/1 Megabits per second (Mbps) fixed broadband. This reform will expand the benefits of high-speed Internet to millions of consumers in every part of the county by transforming the existing USF into a new Connect America Fund (CAF) focused on broadband. The broad goal is to support the provision of broadband communications in areas that would be unserved without such support or that depend on universal service support for the maintenance of existing broadband service. The FCC has initiated numerous proceedings aimed at implementing its broadband goals.

As part of its reform efforts, the FCC offered over \$1.675 billion annually, for six calendar years (2015-2020), modelbased CAF support to price cap carriers nationwide to fund the deployment of voice and broadband-capable services of at least 10/1 (Mbps) in the eligible areas. CenturyLink accepted \$16.5 million to provide broadband to 29,018 eligible households in Kansas, and AT&T accepted \$18.9 million to provide broadband to 35,375 eligible households in Kansas. Carriers were required to meet specific deployment milestones set by the FCC, including deployment to 100 percent of the supported locations in each state by December 31, 2020, with the FCC authorizing carriers to extend the deadline until December 31, 2021. as a result of the Covid-19 Pandemic. Compliance shall be determined based on the total number of supported locations in a state.

Taking further steps to expand rural broadband deployment, in March of 2016, the FCC approved modernization and reform of its universal service program supporting the nation's rate-of-return carriers by providing approximately \$20 billion in support over ten years, to modernize the universal service program for rate-of-return areas include enabling rate-of-return providers to meet consumer demand for stand-alone broadband by providing support for stand-alone broadband. The reforms include better targeting of support to communities that need it the most.

The FCC further allowed carriers to voluntarily transition from legacy rate-of-return support to model-based support, similar to CAF Phase II, for rate-of-return carriers (also known as Alternative Connect America Cost Model or ACAM). Kansas rate-of-return carriers: Haviland Telephone Company; JBN Telephone Company; Moundridge Telephone Company; S&A Telephone Company; Zenda Telephone Company; and Totah Communications elected to transition from legacy USF support to ACAM support, starting in 2017. Carriers that voluntarily elected to transition to A-CAM support must deploy service providing 10 Mbps/1 Mbps to all funded locations, with faster 25 Mbps/3 Mbps service required in areas of higher population density. Carriers are required to meet specific deployment milestones required by the FCC. Because the amount of federal high-cost support a carrier receives is included in the calculation of high-cost KUSF support received by a rate-of-return regulated carrier, changes in federal support may affect the KUSF - although the KUSF support for rate-ofreturn carriers remains subject to the \$30 million cap.

In December 2019, the FCC offered additional funding to rate-of-return carriers that receive A-CAM support if a carrier expanded the availability of 25/3 Mbps broadband, while deploying at least 10/1 Mbps to new locations in its service area. The FCC also provided an opportunity for rate-of-return carriers that did not elect to transition to A-CAM support in 2016 to transition to A-CAM II model-based support in return for specifically tailored obligations to deploy 25/3 Mbps broadband. H&B Communications; LaHarpe Telephone Co., Inc.; MoKan Dial Inc.; Moundridge Telephone Co.; Rural Telephone Service Company; and Twin Valley Telephone, Inc. elected A-CAM II support. The FCC further authorized additional support for those carriers that elect to remain on legacy rate-of-return support in exchange to build-out 25/3 Mbps broadband.

In August 2019, the FCC proposed Auction 904, a reverse auction, to build

on the Connect America Fund Phase II (CAF II) auction and bring broadband service to Americans living in unserved areas. The Rural Digital Opportunity Fund (RDOF) is the FCC's next step in bridging the digital divide to efficiently fund the deployment of broadband networks in rural America. Through a two-phase reverse auction mechanism, the FCC will direct up to \$20.4 billion over ten years to finance up to gigabit speed broadband networks in unserved rural areas, connecting millions of American homes and businesses to digital opportunity.

The RDOF Phase I auction (up to \$16.0 B) opened on October 29, 2020, and targeted over six million homes and businesses in census blocks that are entirely unserved by voice and broadband with speeds of at least 25/3 Mbps. On December 7, 2020, the FCC announced the Auction 904 winning bidders, awarding \$9.23 billion of the budgeted \$16 billion for the ten-year period to 180 companies to deploy voice and broadband services to 5,295,771 locations in 61,766 census blocks in 49 states and one territory. Twelve companies, were awarded a total of \$62.1 million to deploy service to 46,827 Kansas locations. The Commission granted ETC designation to ten of the companies and two of the companies forfeited their awards. Five Kansas companies began to receive RDOF support in 2021 and, by September 2022, three additional Kansas companies, for a total of eight companies, were receiving RDOF I support.

Water

OVERVIEW

The Kansas Corporation Commission (KCC) regulates four water companies, none of which fall into the large utility category. These water companies serve a customer base ranging from as few as 60 to as many as 1,850. Customers served by these companies typically live in a suburban area approximately two to ten miles outside the city. The water supplied varies from city water supplied by a nearby town to ground water supplied by the company's own water wells. The water companies regulated by the KCC are noted in the next column. There is one ongoing docket associated with these companies.


Financial Information and Other Metrics

OVERVIEW

The KCC sets rates for electric, natural gas, telecommunications, and water utilities on a rate base/rate of return basis for public or private utilities or a Times Interest Earned (TIER)/Debt Service Coverage Ratio (DSC) basis for cooperatives. For the electric, natural gas, and rural local exchange companies, the amount of capital investment, fuel and purchased power expense, total revenues, and total expenses are measured in billions of dollars. Following this overview section, more details are provided regarding financial information and other metrics for all the KCC jurisdictional utility industries on a consolidated and individual industry basis.


GAS, ELECTRIC, AND RURAL LOCAL EXCHANGE COMPANIES TOTAL GROSS PLANT | 2017–2021




ELECTRIC COMPANIES STATEWIDE GROSS PLANT | 2017–2021



Total Revenues






RESIDENTIAL ELECTRIC BILL COMPARISON | JULY 2021 - JUNE 2022

The following chart represents a comparison of monthly bills based on average residential consumption of 914 kWh.



Generation Planning Survey

The Commission continues to monitor the generation capacity and reliability of Kansas electric utilities. Staff members annually review generation and load forecasts of Kansas electric utilities to ascertain whether there is adequate electric supply to meet the needs of Kansas electric consumers. All Kansas electricity suppliers are subject to the oversight of the Southwest Power Pool (SPP). Under the authority vested in it by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the SPP is responsible to ensure a reliable supply of power in Kansas. Recent action taken by SPP has established the need for the Planning Reserve Margin (PRM)1 to be increased from 12% to 15% by the summer of

2023. In conjunction with the increased PRM, SPP has agreed to modify the method of accrediting generation capacity to more accurately reflect the performance of each generator. This modification will be phased in over the next five years. Currently, accredited supply and PRM are based on the nameplate capacity of the generator and the summer peaking load of the system. Appendix C of the 2023 Electric Supply and Demand Report contains excerpts of a recent report provided by SPP² to its Regional State Committee³ that provides more information on proposed accreditation techniques and the recent modification of the PRM.

Based on its review, staff determined that, at this time, forecasted electric generation capacity and planning to meet future changes in system load in the State of Kansas appears sufficient given current load and generation forecasts planned. Although utilities in the chart do indicate deficiencies in the future, planned generation capacity additions can be made that will satisfy future planning responsibility. The chart on this page describes the generation capacity situation major utilities in Kansas face going forward.

In the Matter of the Application of The Empire District Electric Company for Approval of the Commission to Make Certain Changes in its Charges for Electric Service.

May 28, 2021, The Empire District Electric Company (Empire) filed an abbreviated rate case Application to make certain changes in its charges for electric service. Pursuant to the Commission Order in its last general rate case, Docket No. 19-EPDE-223-RTS, Empire's abbreviated rate case was limited to: (1) recovering the capital and operating costs relating to its acquisition of the Neosho Ridge, North Fork Ridge, and Kings Point wind farms (collectively, the Wind Projects); (2) accounting for the retirement of its Asbury coal plant (Asbury); and (3) capturing the revenue requirement impact directly related to the non-growth plant and related accumulated depreciation and accumulated deferred income tax balances as of the end of the test year ending June 30, 2020.

Empire's Application indicated a gross revenue deficiency of \$4,465,956. Empire proposed to offset the gross revenue deficiency by refunding \$2,774,857 relating to the retirement of Asbury to ratepayers over a three-year period, or \$924,952 annually, through its proposed Asbury Retirement Rider (ARR). Additionally, Empire projected net wind revenues in the amount of \$2,817,422, which it proposed to flow through the Energy Cost Adjustment (ECA) mechanism. Therefore, Empire proposed a net revenue increase to customers of \$723,582 or 4.28%. Subsequently, on September 15, 2021, Empire updated its filing to reflect updated costs for the Wind Projects. As a result of this update, Empire increased its revenue deficiency to \$4,490,806 and reduced its projected net wind revenues to \$2,728,907, bringing the net revenue increase to customers to \$836,947 or 4.95%. In both the original and updated filings, Empire also proposed an alternative methodology for recovering costs associated with the Wind Projects. In lieu of recovering these

costs in the revenue requirement under the traditional ratemaking method, Empire proposed using an alternative levelized revenue requirement approach. More specifically, Empire proposed a Levelized Cost of Energy (LCOE) methodology whereby costs associated with the Wind Projects would be collected on a levelized basis of \$33.73/MWh from ratepayers over a period of twenty years.

On January 14, 2022, Staff filed direct testimony, including schedules and exhibits supporting a recommended base rate revenue increase of \$1,300,242, offset by a three-year annual credit to customers of \$1,497,756 relating to the retirement of Asbury and projected wind revenues of \$2,636,349 for a net revenue decrease of \$2,833,863. Staff also testified that the Wind Projects were not necessary for Empire to provide efficient and sufficient service to Kansas customers and therefore should not be included in rates. However, if the Commission determined to include the Wind Projects in rates then Empire's proposal should be adjusted to remove the traditional revenue requirement effects of the wind farms and alternatively include a levelized cost, market-competitive Purchased Power Agreement (PPA) rate for the wind investments in the revenue requirement based upon Staff's marketcompetitive PPA price of \$16.32/MWh. On January 13, 2022, CURB filed its direct testimony and exhibits, recommending a revenue requirement decrease of \$345,690, excluding the costs of the Wind Projects. While CURB also took the position that the Wind Projects were not necessary to serve Kansas customers, CURB recommended that, should the Commission authorize Empire to recover the costs of the Wind Project, the cost be recovered on a LCOE basis of \$23.97/MWh.

On February 15, 2022, Empire filed rebuttal testimony responding to the direct testimonies that were filed by Staff and CURB. Beginning on February 22, 2022, the Parties met to discuss the possible settlement of the contested issues in this matter. Settlement discussions were ongoing until March 1, 2022, when a final partial settlement was reached.

On March 2, 2022, the Parties filed a Joint Motion for Approval of Unanimous

Partial Settlement Agreement on Revenue Requirement (Partial Settlement). The Partial Settlement resolved all issues related to Empire's revenue requirement except those related to the Wind Projects. Specifically, the Partial Settlement provided for a base revenue reduction of \$636,091. The settlement amount excluded all costs associated with the Wind Projects to be presented to the Commission for determination at the evidentiary hearing. On March 8 and 9, 2022, the Commission held an evidentiary hearing focused on all issues related to the Wind Projects. Subsequently, on May 16, 2022, Empire filed a Motion to Withdraw Request to Recover Acquisition and Operating Costs of Wind Projects in Rates. This would allow Empire to seek recovery for the Wind Projects in a future general rate case and leave only the unanimous Partial Settlement for Commission decision in the

On May 26, 2022, the Commission granted Empire's motion to withdraw, without prejudice, its request to recover its acquisition and operating costs relating to the Wind Projects as well as approved the Partial Settlement.

(Evergy) filed an Application for approval of their Transportation Electrification Portfolio, which includes rebate programs, rates for charging services, and associated education and program administration budget, and the authorization to use a deferral accounting mechanism to track program costs associated with the Portfolio. In addition, Evergy also sought a finding from the Commission that a limited and targeted expansion of its Clean Charge Network (CCN) is prudent from a decisional perspective. The Commission modified the Non-Unanimous Settlement to require filing of quarterly reports identified in the Settlement Agreement that provide a comparison of the expenditures to bid costs with, at a minimum, level of detail of: 1) the percent of project completed to data; 2) the amount spent to date compared with previously expected level of spend; 3) the total budget versus expenditures to date with explanation of variances; 4) information detailing SPP agreements, invoices, and agreements with other Kansas jurisdictional public utilities; and 5) information detailing applicable FERC filings.

In addition, the Commission requires that the Financial Guarantee provided in the Non-Unanimous Settlement be updated to specify that it will apply to all NEECH successors and assigns.

Finally, with regard to the 25 miles of the Wolf Creek-Blackberry Transmission Project that is likely to parallel an existing Evergy transmission line, the Commission revises the Non-Unanimous Settlement to direct NEET Southwest and Evergy to collaboratively work together in good faith to fully consider, study, and evaluate the double circuit option in a timely manner. The Commission finds this revision important as double circuiting this portion has the potential to reduce costs, land owner encumbrances, and environmental impacts on approximately 25% of the Project route.

Each utility was required to file a compliance filing in its Docket detailing the extent of the costs incurred during the storm, and presenting a plan to minimize the financial effects of the storm for customers.

On July 2, 2021, Evergy filed its customer plan to minimize the impacts of the Winter Storm for its customers. Evergy reported that its Evergy Kansas Central division incurred \$33.7 million in excess fuel costs and \$113.1 million in extra purchased power expense during the Winter Storm. Evergy requests to recover these costs over a two year period, which will increase the average residential bill by \$4.69 per month from April 2022 through March 2024. Evergy also reported that its Evergy Kansas Metro division received \$44.6 million in lower overall fuel and purchased power costs as a result of the event (due to wholesale power margins during this time). Evergy proposes to return these excess off-system sales margins to customers over a two year period, offset by \$5.7 million in allocation shortfalls caused by different allocation methods in Kansas and Missouri. On January 21, 2022, Staff filed its R&R recommending approval of Evergy's cost recovery plan, with the following conditions: 1) the parties to the Docket should confer and attempt to reach an agreement on the level of carrying charges that accumulate on Evergy's deferred cost levels; 2) the deferred benefit accumulated by Evergy Kansas Metro should be distributed over the same time period as the deferred costs for Evergy Kansas Central; and 3) a denial of the request to retroactively change the jurisdictional allocator that went into the determination

of EKM's benefit levels, instead this issue was reserved for the next rate case. Staff did not encounter any imprudent or any inappropriate practices regarding fuel and purchase power during the winter weather event. Also, Staff included over a dozen recommendations regarding steps to help mitigate issues during another such Winter Storm. These include, but are not limited to, various upgrades, retrofits, onsite storage, and additional winterization strategies and weighing the cost of each against both potential and likely savings. Only January 31, 2022, CURB responded to Staff's R&R. CURB agreed with Staff on most all points and conclusions, but wanted to have further discussions regarding the various operational upgrades and the full level of benefits they will give when weighed against the additional costs. CURB did also have two additional recommendations: to disseminate educational information on use conservation in situations like those faced in the winter storm and to make a prioritized plan for who to curtail and when if the need arises again. CURB also wanted to consider lowering the carrying charges. Finally, CURB emphasized they feel there is a need for low-income assistance tariffs, though mentioned potentially conflicting court precedents which may or may not allow them. On April 22, 2022, a Non-Unanimous Settlement Agreement was submitted by Evergy, CURB, KCC, and KEPCo. The Agreement allowed Evergy to recover the extraordinary costs associated with Winter Storm Uri over a two-year period, beginning April of 2023. This would cost the average residential customer \$2.82/month over this time frame. The Agreement called for Evergy Kansas Metro to return the benefit it accumulated from off-system sales over a one year period, providing approximately \$6.60/month of benefit to residential customers for one year. The carrying cost to be accumulated during this time was 1%. Additionally, The Agreement also contained an acknowledgement of implementing the different operations-related recommendations from Staff's R&R, with the exception of four. Each customers' share of their costs will be based on their kWh usage during the month of February 2021. 2.) The amount calculated will be recovered in equal monthly payments over a thirty-six (36) month period. Large Industrial customers will have the option of paying their obligation in fewer than 36 months if the provide notice to Southern Pioneer. 3.) If a customer disconnects from service, the amount still owed on this charge will be included as part of the disconnect fee for that customer and collected accordingly. Additionally, Southern Pioneer revised its plan to include carrying charges at the company's actual cost of debt, plus the required cushion/margin that its lenders require. This allows these costs to be collected from the customers that caused them as opposed to other customers like transmission customers that do not purchase power from Southern Pioneer. On December 20, 2021, Staff filed a Report and Recommendation detailing its review of the operational and financial review of Southern Pioneer's performance during Winter Storm Uri. Staff recommended approval of Southern Pioneer's cost recovery plan, which called for allocating the extraordinary costs to individual customers based on each customer's usage during February 2021. These costs would then be recovered over 36-months in equal fixed installments. On average, this resulted in a customer impact of \$7.89/month for a residential customer. Additionally, Staff recommended allowing Southern Pioneer to recover carrying costs associated with financing these recoveries over this period. The carrying costs identified were 2.889%, inclusive of the minimum coverage ratio adder that was required by CoBank, Southern Pioneer's lender.

On December 30, 2021, CURB filed a response to Staff's R&R, indicating agreement with Staff's conclusions and recommendations. As to future revisions to the amount to be collected under the Financial Plan, CURB also recommended that (1) the parties and the Commission review carrying charge levels and

recovery periods at the time the revisions are known in order to account for any changes to Southern Pioneer's Formula Based Rate or other factors related to the revision, and (2) any potential refunds after the original plan has concluded be considered for special treatment. If the Company is allowed to spread the refund over a longer period of time, CURB stated that the Commission should consider the charging of interest on that refund, and that should such a situation arise, the parties should confer and make a subsequent recommendation on how to treat those amounts.




GAS COMPANIES STATEWIDE GROSS PLANT | 2017–2021

GAS COMPANIES GROSS PLANT, BY COMPANY | 2021











On May 7, 2021, Black Hills filed an Application to make changes in its rates and charges for natural gas service. Black Hills requested an increase of \$2.5 million. The company cited the following factors as drivers of the rate increase: (1) continued use of the Gas System Reliability Surcharge; (2) general cost increases since the last rate case; (3) additional investment in plant; (4) increases in wages, medical expenses, materials and supplier costs; (5) two part rate design with an increased monthly facility and volumetric charges; (6) new depreciation rates for Black Hills' general plant; and (7) a request for the creation of a Tax Adjustment Rider.

On September 10, 2021, Staff and CURB filed direct testimony. In its direct testimony, Staff recommended a revenue requirement decrease of \$3.69 million; and CURB recommended a decrease of \$3.59 million. Staff opposed Black Hills' proposed Tax Adjustment Rider, while CURB supported the proposed rider. Freedom Pipeline did not filed direct testimony. Black Hills filed rebuttal testimony on October 1, 2021.

On October 8, 2021, the parties filed a Join Motion to Approve Settlement Agreement. Freedom Pipeline has not signed the Agreement but has indicated that it is not opposed to the Agreement. The Settlement Agreement supports no net change in base rates, but a tax adjustment rider that will provide \$3,024,315 in rate refunds to customers over the next three years.

On February 15, 2021, the Commission issued an Emergency Order in Docket No. 21-GIMX-303-MIS. In response to the events surrounding Winter Storm URI, in which extreme arctic weather was placing stress on utility systems and increasing the price of wholesale gas and electricity to all-time highs, the Commission required all jurisdictional natural gas and electric utilities to coordinate efforts and take all reasonably feasible, lawful and appropriate actions to ensure adequate transportation of natural gas and electricity to interconnected, non-jurisdictional Kansas utilities. Additionally, jurisdictional utility providers were ordered to do everything necessary to ensure natural gas and electricity service continued to be provided to customers in Kansas, no matter the cost. Additionally, the Commission authorized each jurisdictional utility to defer its extraordinary costs to a regulatory asset account, with carrying charges at the WACC.

On March 1, 2021, Staff filed a report and recommendation requesting that the Commission open separate company-specific general investigation dockets in order to manage the Staff investigation into how each jurisdictional electric and natural gas utility was prepared for the cold weather event, how each responded during the event, and how the event will impact each utility's Kansas customers. Staff recommended that individual dockets be opened for Evergy (inclusive of EKC and EKM), Empire District Electric

Company, Southern Pioneer Electric Company, Kansas Gas Service, Atmos Energy Corporation, Black Hills Energy, and American Energy Gas Service. Additionally, Staff recommended that each utility file a compliance filing in their individual docket that contained a plan for how the utility was planning on minimizing the effects of the winter weather event for its customers.

On June 16, 2021, Black Hills filed its Customer Plan to minimize the effects of the extraordinary gas costs it incurred to maintain service during the winter storm. According to Company Testimony, during and as a result of the storm Black Hills incurred approximately \$87.9 million in extraordinary gas costs and that those Extraordinary Gas Costs. If the approximately \$87.9 million in Extraordinary Gas Costs were to be recovered as part of the ACA it would result in an average monthly bill increase of \$53.51 for a period of one year. This is an average bill increase of 96%, for an average residential customer using 56 therms per month. In order to reduce the financial impact on customers, Black Hills requests the Commission's approval to recover its Extraordinary Gas Costs over a period of five years with carrying costs at Black Hills WACC, currently 7.98%, beginning August 1, 2021. This would result in an average monthly bill increase of \$12.23, or 22%, for an average residential customer using 56 therms per month. Charges for recovery of the Extraordinary Gas Costs would appear

as a separate line item on customer bills. Under Black Hills' Plan the Extraordinary Gas Costs and associated carrying costs will be allocated among rate schedules based on February 2021 usage and exclude the Irrigation sales rate schedule.

On November 9, 2021, Black Hills, Staff, the Citizens Utility Ratepayer Board, and the Natural Gas Transportation Customer Coalition submitted a settlement agreement for the Commission's consideration. This agreement called for Black Hills to recover \$87,897,745 in extraordinary gas costs over a period of five years from February 1, 2022 to January 31, 2027. The agreement reduced the carrying charge down from 7.98% in Black Hills' original filing down to 1.30% for the calendar year 2021 and 5.71% for the five year period beginning January 1, 2022. This reduction in carrying charges reduced the average residential rate impact of this plan from \$12.23/month to \$11.47/month. The agreement also contains a provision to prevent sales customers from abandoning service just to avoid the Winter Storm charges, as well as a provision that allows new customers to be exempted from the charge if they can prove that they were a transportation customer during the event or have already paid their Winter Storm Uri charges in full from another utility. Irrigation customers were excluded from the Uri charge given the evidence in the record that they did not use gas during the extreme winter weather experienced in February 2021.

According to the Company's Application, during and as a result of the Winter Event Atmos Energy incurred approximately \$88 million in extraordinary gas costs and those costs were prudently incurred during an unprecedented market disruption event. If the Extraordinary Gas Costs including carrying costs, of approximately \$94.1 million were to be recovered as part of the ACA it would result in an average monthly bill increase of \$47.70, or 85%, for an average residential customer using 70.98 ccf per month. In order to reduce the financial impact on customers, Atmos Energy requests the Commission's approval to recover its Extraordinary Gas

Costs through a securitized bond issuance with a period of up to 15 years. A bond issuance with a period of 10 years would result in an average monthly bill increase of \$5.56, or 10%, for an average residential customer using 70.98 ccf per month. Charges for recovery of the Qualified Extraordinary Costs would appear as a separate line item on customer bills. If the Commission chooses not to approve the Plan, the Company asks that it be allowed to recover its extraordinary gas costs and other costs related to the Winter Event, including carrying costs based upon the Company's weighted cost of capital, over 3 years through a Winter Event Rider. This would result in an average monthly bill increase of \$18.06, or 32%, for an average residential customer using 70.98 ccf per month. Atmos' plan can be found here:

On February 9, 2022, Atmos, Staff, and CURB filed a Motion to Approve Settlement Agreement with the Commission. The agreement called for Atmos to file an Application with the Commission requesting permission to issue Securitized Utility Tariff Bonds in order to recover \$102.5 million total extraordinary costs associated with Winter Storm Uri (this figure includes anticipated interest expenses associated with the securitized bonds).

While the Agreement allowed Atmos to recover carrying charges on the amount of the extraordinary deferred costs, the rate was reduced to 2% annually, from the original request of 8.396% in Atmos' Application. This resulted in a reduction of carrying charges to \$2.56 million, from \$9.47 million, a reduction of \$7.21 million.

Atmos agreed to pass through in full to ratepayers any payments it receives as a result of Federal or State governmental relief stemming from market manipulation proceedings.

Formal testimony was filed in support of the Agreement, and an evidentiary hearing was held on March 4, 2022. On March 24, 2022, the Commission issued an Order Approving the Unanimous Settlement Agreement.

On May 28, 2021, KGS filed a Motion for Limited Waiver of the OFO/POC Penalties that it would otherwise be allowed to charge to Gas Marketers and individually balanced transportation customers as a result of those marketers/customers under deliveries of gas during the Winter Storm event. KGS' motion requested to remove the penalty multipliers and instead charge only the assumed cost of replacement gas, which was designated in the tariff as the Gas Daily Southern Star Index price. Several interveners protested the motion for limited waiver. A procedural schedule was established and settlement discussions ensued. On October 8, 2021, all parties to this agreement, with the exception of a coalition of transportation customers and an energy marketing company, submitted a settlement agreement to the Commission on the issue of the petition for a limited waiver of the multipliers in KGS' penalty tariffs. The settlement called for a further reduction and refinement of the methodology for determining the gas cost amounts in lieu of a penalty.

Instead of the assumed gas cost amount

that is listed in the tariff of \$117,244,479, the Parties agreed to a calculated gas cost amount based on KGS' actual gas costs during the event of \$105,347,666. In addition, the agreement contains provisions that allow for the recognition of the days during the OFO/POC events that individual customers/marketers were long gas to the system. This long gas represents approximately \$22,395,868 of gas that wouldn't have otherwise been recognized/ compensated in the penalty provisions of KGS' tariff. This \$22.395 million in long gas is only paid to transportation customers in the event that KGS is able to recover all of the short gas, in the amount of \$105.347 million. Anything in excess of \$82.951 million will be distributed pro rata to the parties that were long during the event. On July 30, 2021, KGS filed its Plan to Minimize the Financial Effects of the 2021 Winter Weather Event for its customers. KGS' plan calls for KGS to file for approval to issue Securitized Utility Tariff Bonds to finance the extraordinary costs incurred during the event. KGS reported that it incurred approximately \$373 million in purchased gas costs during the event, with an additional \$224,790 in extraordinary O&M costs. When all carrying charges were considered through the time of issuing the securitized bonds, KGS estimated it would securitize approximately \$451 million, which KGS estimated would cost residential customers between \$5-\$10 a month (larger bill impacts for shorter amortization of costs, five years, versus ten years).

On November 19, 2021, Staff, CURB, and the NGTCC (a coalition of transportation customers) filed a settlement agreement with the Commission calling for the approval of the financial plan. The agreement was supported or not opposed by the following parties:

- (a) BlueMark Energy, LLC ("BlueMark");
- (b) Freedom Pipeline, LLC ("Freedom");
- (c) National Gas Transportation Customer Coalition ("NGTCC"); (d) Wood River Energy LLC ("Wood River"); (e) State of Kansas, ex rel., Derek Schmidt, Attorney General ("AG"); (f) CURB; (g) Atmos Energy Corporation ("Atmos Energy"); (h) Constellation NewEnergy - Gas Division LLC ("Constellation"); (i) Catholic Diocese of Wichita; (i) Bonavia Properties LLC ("Bonavia"); (k) Temple Live Wichita LLC ("Temple Live");16 (1) Foley Rebuild Center LLC and Foley Equipment Company ("Foley"); and (m) Central Christian Church of Wichita, Kansas. The agreement was opposed by Symmetry, a gas marketing company.

The agreement identified \$366 million in extraordinary gas and other costs that KGS incurred during the winter weather event. Additionally, the agreement called for KGS to file an application seeking approval of a financing order allowing for the issuance of Securitized Utility Tariff bonds.

The agreement also calls for reducing the carrying charge accumulating on the balances to 2%, down from 8.6012% as authorized by the Commission's Emergency Order in the 21-303 Docket. Lastly, the agreement calls for reducing the carrying charge agreed to in the Limited Waiver for Penalty Multipliers portion of the proceeding down to 2% also. The filed agreement can be found here:

As part of a comprehensive settlement on the Financial Plan, which was filed on November 19, 2021, it was also agreed that a provision of the originally proposed Waiver Settlement should be modified. Instead of calculating carrying charges using KGS's weighted average cost of capital of 8.6%, as provided for in the Commission's Emergency Order, the carrying charges under the Agreement shall be calculated using 2.0%. In addition,

language was added to the Waiver Settlement to make clear that all penalty payments received by KGS from marketers and Individually Balance Transportation Customers that are received prior to the filing of the separate application for a Finance Order will be used by KGS to reduce the Qualified Extraordinary Costs to be recovered using the Securitized Utility Bonds. All penalty amounts received after that filing will be credited by KGS to KGS's sales customers through the COGR/ACA on an annual basis.

As a result of the negotiations and inclusion of these provisions in the Waiver Settlement, six additional parties have agreed to support the instant Motion and Agreement. Consequently, all parties to this Docket, except for one, Symmetry Energy Solutions, LLC, either are signatories to the Amended Nonunanimous Settlement Agreement on the Waiver or have indicated that they are not opposed to it. Symmetry remains opposed to both the Amended Nonunanimous Settlement Agreement and the Financial Plan settlement.

Testimony was filed in support of the Revised Waiver Settlement by several parties, and Symmetry filed opposition testimony to the Settlement.

Beginning on January 11, 2022, and continuing on January 18, 2022, negotiations were conducted that resulted in the inclusion of revised terms to the Amended Nonunanimous Settlement which have been agreed to or not opposed by all parties to this docket, including Symmetry, resulting in a Unanimous Settlement Agreement that resolves all issues in this docket. Specifically, all parties are either Signatories or do not oppose: 1) the instant Unanimous Settlement Agreement (which replaces the Amended Nonunanimous Settlement); and 2) the pending Financial Plan Settlement.

The Amended Nonunanimous Settlement Agreement contained a revised methodology to assess the costs of replacement gas that the marketers and transportation customers failed to deliver to their customers during Winter Storm Uri. This Negotiated Gas Cost Penalty amount was revised to \$65,444,505, down from \$105,347,666. This calculation accounted for the cost of both Spot Priced Gas and Gas Daily Callable Gas purchases, to calculate the penalties. This pricing reflects

the fact that KGS utilized a blend of both spot market purchases and previously secured Gas Daily Callable volumes to secure sufficient incremental gas for the system as a whole during the OFO and POC days. Importantly, this pricing still excluded storage gas and first of month baseload gas purchases.

Formal Testimony in Support of the Agreement was filed, and an evidentiary hearing was held. Evidentiary hearings were also held concerning the financial plan settlement.

Staff's investigation into the operational and financial aspects of Winter Storm Uri produced several recommended changes to gas purchasing practices, hedging plans, and transportation tariffs. 

Water service for the utility customers continued to deteriorate in the spring of 2020 leading to Staff petitioning the Commission for a motion of Emergency relief and requesting the Commission to order Towns Riverview to take certain steps to provide water service.


On June 25, 2020, the Commission issued an order finding Towns Riverview is

a public utility and ordering the utility to comply with the terms found in Staff's motion for emergency relief. The Commission also ordered Staff to continue to monitor the utility to determine if sufficient and efficient utility service is being provided. Staff's investigation is ongoing at this time.








PERCENTAGE OF CONNECTIONS BY DOWNSTREAM SPEED | AS OF 06/30/2019

Kansas' downstream speed metrics are comparable to the nation as a whole.







TELECOMMUNICATION UTILITIES RECEIVING KUSF SUPPORT | FY18-FY22

On May 14, 2021, a coalition of Rural Local Exchange Carriers (RLECs) appealed the Commission's Orders implementing legislatively mandated pro-rata reductions to the Rural Local Exchange Carriers' (RLECs) Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) subsidies for exceeding the \$30 million statutory cap on annual KUSF payments to the RLECs. Following Oral Argument, on April 29, 2022, the District Court of Shawnee County issued its Memorandum Decision and Order, denying the RLECs' Petition for Judicial Review. On May 22, 2022, the RLECs filed their notice of appeal to the Court of Appeals. In the RLECs' docketing statement filed July 22, 2022, they claim, "In 2013, the legislature, without explanation, broke its promise and instituted a \$30,000,000 cap on the amount of cumulative high cost support to be paid to RLECs."

On October 11, 2022, the RLECs filed their Brief with the Court of Appeals, reiterating their arguments that a legislatively imposed statutory cap is an illegal takings under the 5th Amendment of U.S. Constitution and violates other statutory provisions, and thus should be repealed. The RLECs are essentially challenging the legislature's authority to impose any constraints on the annual Kansas Universal Service Fund (KUSF) subsidies they receive. The Commission's Brief is currently due November 10, 2022, and the RLECs would then have 14 days to file a reply brief. We expect the Court to schedule oral argument following the briefing. There is no statutory deadline for the Court to issue its opinion.

The role of the Transportation Division of the Kansas Corporation Commission (KCC) is to ensure appropriate and effective regulatory oversight of motor carriers, with the goal of protecting the public interest and promoting safety through comprehensive planning, licensing, education, and inspection to the extent not preempted by federal law.

Executive Summary

The Transportation Division provides comprehensive support to all Kansas based motor carriers operating commercial motor vehicles in the state of Kansas. The Division provides informational services to motor carriers in Kansas through its statewide live safety seminar program and its Special Investigator stationed throughout the state. The Division is responsible for establishing the regulations that apply to motor carriers through both state statutes and administrative regulations, ensuring that businesses, drivers and vehicles meet the appropriate economic and safety regulations to ensure the safety of the motoring public. Through collaborations with state and federal agencies as well as industry stakeholders the Division helps direct enforcement of those same rules and regulations. As our report shows, the results of those efforts have been largely successful, even in the face of an ongoing global pandemic.

Core Functions

As the lead agency that regulates motor carriers and businesses that operate commercial motor vehicles in the state, the performance measures identified in this report are a product of the Division's

four Core Functions:

- 1. Administrative Regulations and Statutory Requirements;
- 2. Education and Compliance Programs;
- 3. Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN);
- 4. Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) Program;

The Core Functions are designed to maintain continuity, educate the industry we serve while protecting the motoring public. Our ability to communicate with our industry partners is what sets us apart. In pursuit of our goals, the Division strives to be professional, adaptable, and committed to customer service and safety. In order to be most effective, the Division has developed strong working relationships with state, federal and local authorities, as well as the regulated community.

The development and implementation of motor carrier regulations and adoption of federal motor carrier safety regulations is a core function of the Division. Periodic updates to the Kansas motor carrier regulations are required by 49 C.F.R. Part 350. If updates are not made it could result in monetary consequences for our state's motor carrier safety enforcement, affecting multiple state agencies and grants. Because updating the motor carrier regulations effects multiple agencies, the Division meets with representatives from the Kansas Highway Patrol (KHP) to annually review the motor carrier regulations (K.A.R. 82-4-1 et. seq.), and draft proposed updates, amendments, additions and/or deletions.

The KCC completes its review and drafts proposed regulations which then go through a review process with the Division of Budget, Department of Administration and the Attorney General's office. Developing a regulation strategy that meets federal regulations and is calibrated for Kansas based carriers, helps set a level of regulation that takes into account the types of carriers operating in Kansas and how enforcement of the applicable regulations best apply. Setting unrealistic expectations without evaluating the realties facing Kansas based carriers, would hinder program goals and negatively affect performance measures.

The Division takes on an important

role in maintaining the KCC's motor carrier statutes to ensure the Division has authority to complete its core functions and minimize any unnecessary and outdated regulatory burden on the motor carrier industry. The Division proposes periodic changes to the statutes to ensure they are applicable in the current motor carrier industry context and conform to changes made to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administrations rules and policies. These changes include repealing statutes that no longer apply and modifying language to better describe the reality of the motor carrier industry today.

The 2022 Legislature passed SB 313. The bill provides operators with the new Automated Driving System (ADS) Equipped Vehicles to operate in Kansas. It also allows the operation of driverlesscapable vehicles and On-demand Driverless-capable Vehicle Networks without a human driver under certain circumstances. Provisions added by the bill will be added to the Uniform Act Regulating Traffic on Highways. The bill created an Autonomous Vehicle Advisory Committee (AV Advisory Committee). The membership of the AV Advisory Committee includes legislators, other appointees, and organization representatives. The Chair of the Commission will appoint two members to the AV Committee.

Concerns with the Bill:

- Section #2, the bill attempts to limit the weight/size of the ADS equipped vehicles to 34,000 pounds, however, the language used only limits the tandem axles to 34,000 pounds not the commercial motor vehicle (CMV).
- Section #2, provides exemptions for requiring a conventional human driver in the ADS engaged vehicles if they meet certain criteria.
- Section #3, Financial Responsibility, the bill references minimum limits under K.S.A. 40-3104 and K.S.A. 40-3107.
- Section #4, Duties if an injury or fatality crash occurs, there is no provision to require the company to cease operations pending official review.

• Section #6, Authority for Regulation, the bill requires KHP to promulgate rules and regulations; these are the duties of the KCC to regulate motor carriers in Kansas.

The Transportation Division will participate with stakeholders on a trailer bill to supplement these and other deficiencies during the 2023 legislature.

Education Program

The education program is the foundation for both the economic and safety programs of the Division. It is necessary to establish an effective and efficient infrastructure that focuses on sound safety training and enforcement programs aimed at identifying and minimizing unsafe conditions potentially harmful to the motor carrier and the traveling public. The education program was developed for all new and existing public and private motor carriers in Kansas.

In FY 2022, the Division began mailing letters to all new entrant intrastate and interstate MC's that applied for a USDOT number. The letters invited the MC's to create a KTRAN account to receive regulatory alerts, informed them of potential operating authority and interstate UCR requirements, and invited them to answer a questionnaire to determine both economic and safety applicability to ensure they start up in compliance. KCC's Special Investigators (SIs) are involved in conducting the educational safety seminars. The goal is to help educate new carriers, as well as out of compliance motor carriers, about current rules and regulations. The virtual classes have been very popular with the industry and have benefited staff by saving them time and the expense of traveling to the different training locations.

Conducting the safety seminars virtually has allowed the Division to conduct more seminars and has allowed motor carriers easier access to these seminars. These seminars can be accessed by anyone with a computer or smart phone. The SIs also conduct individual "refresher" safety programs when specifically requested by a motor carrier. Motor Carriers are notified of seminar dates at the time they

apply for KCC authority. Safety seminar information is also located on the KCC website. Safety training information is forwarded to various transportation associations for inclusion in their newsletters and websites.

The Division has put an emphasis on serving rural motor carriers. The rural motor carriers have access to the KCC SIs assigned to regions all over the state. Our SIs serve as a local resource to carriers and can respond to specific questions that come up in the field.

HUMAN TRAFFICKING AWARENESS TRAINING ADDED TO EDUCATION PROGRAM

The KCC has partnered with the Attorney General's Office, Kansas Highway Patrol (KHP), Kansas Motor Carriers Association (KMCA) and Truckers Against Trafficking (TAT) to include training in identifying and reporting suspected human trafficking as part of the motor carrier safety seminars which take place throughout the state. The Truckers Against Trafficking training is part of a focus aimed at reducing human trafficking by enlisting the help of motor carriers to report suspicious activity they encounter as they travel the nation's highways. The training began in February of 2016 and since that time more than 5,000 motor carrier representatives in Kansas have received the training.

Kansas Trucking Regulatory Assistance Network (KTRAN)

One of KTRAN's functions is to welcome New Registrants with each passing week. The system allows motor carriers and businesses to apply and renew their intrastate authorities and directs all interstate motor carriers wanting to renew their current or previous years UCR to the National Registration System (NRS) for renewals and adjustments. The project serves to enhance the Kansas E-Credentialing capability by establishing an interactive process where carriers walk through a logical set of questions to determine what authorities, forms and processes need to be followed to meet the carrier's needs. The project is an intelligent, interactive front-end to

the TruckingKS.org portal, creating an efficient business process for carriers and state motor carrier personnel.

Additionally, KTRAN serves to further integrate information about Kansas motor carriers, commercial vehicles and commercial drivers. For example, roadside enforcement has access to Commission authority, Intrastate Outof-Service Orders and Driver Waiver information through Kansas Commercial Vehicle Information Exchange Window (CVIEW) query windows utilizing a new system-to-system interface built as part of this project. Further, KCC officials are automatically notified of PRISM OOS status changes as well as having a realtime interface to KSCVIEW for PRISM checking of carriers and vehicles prior to issuing KCC authorities. Today, more than 10,000 motor carriers have active KTRAN accounts.

KTRAN is one of the many programs developed through the Kansas Commercial Vehicle Information Systems and Networks (CVISN) program. In Kansas, the Department of Revenue (KDOR) is the lead agency for the CVISN program. Other agencies involved in the Kansas Expanded CVISN Program Plan are the KCC, KHP and KDOT. They have a longstanding relationship and have partnered on numerous projects. The CVISN team shares a strategic vision which includes providing unparalleled customer service; safety compliance education; and effective, balanced enforcement of our state motor carrier rules and regulations.

Federal Unified Carrier Registration (UCR) Program

The UCR Program has not been impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic. The UCR functionalities are web based and allow the customers access from their home or office.

The UCR is a federal registration program managed by the Division, under which a commercial vehicle registrant operating in interstate commerce pays annual renewal fees. The UCR replaced the Single State Registration (SSR) in 2007. The program

annually generates \$4,344,290.00 of which \$1. 3 million is transferred to the Kansas Highway Patrol for use as a match for their Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program (MCSAP) or motor carrier safety related programs. The Division also annually transfers approximately \$1,000,000 dollars to the Kansas Department of Transportation's Highway Fund. The remaining funds are used to fund the Administration of the UCR program and the Division's Educations and Compliance Programs.

Each entity subject to UCR is required to register and pay the fee annually through the National Registration System (NRS). The fees imposed on motor carriers and freight forwarders businesses that operate motor vehicles are graduated through a system of brackets or tiers, based on the

number of vehicles they have operated; brokers and leasing companies, which operate no vehicles themselves, pay a fee at the level that applies to the smallest motor carriers. No UCR credential is issued to a UCR registrant; enforcement is accomplished through online data checks and various types of audit.

UCR defines a commercial motor vehicle (CMV) as: a self-propelled vehicle used on the highways in commerce principally to transport passengers or cargo, if the vehicle:

- Has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross vehicle weight of at least 10,001 pounds, whichever is greater, or
- when connected to trailing equipment has a gross combination weight rating or gross combination weight of at least 10,001 pounds, whichever is greater, or

- Carries placarded amounts of hazardous materials, regardless of the vehicle's weight, or
- Is designed to carry more than 10 passengers, including the driver.

In Kansas, the oversight of non-payment of UCR fees began January 1, 2009, and is conducted through KHP compliance verification through roadside inspections and at the Ports of Entry, the KDOR verifies UCR compliance prior to issuing commercial plates and the KCC Transportation Division verifies UCR compliance through Compliance Reviews and audits on interstate motor carriers.

Under federal law, the Board of Directors of the Unified Carrier Registration Plan ("Board") is required to recommend to the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT), the level of fees to be assessed in each agreement year. Each December, the Board meets to review the amount of fees collected in the previous calendar year and recommends the six fee brackets for the upcoming registration vear either be adjusted or maintained to the USDOT. The USDOT reviews the UCR Boards recommendation and either approves or adjusts the next year's registration fees. The Board recognizes that the recommended adjustments require action in a final rule by the Department and the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA).

The Division's KTRAN program directs motor carriers wanting to renew their current or previous years UCR to the NRS for renewal and adjustments. Transportation Staff are able to remind motor carriers of their UCR renewal obligations through the NRS and KTRAN portals.

The charts to the right demonstrate the success of the Transportation Division's UCR compliance efforts. For the last two years, Kansas has been the top jurisdiction in the Midwest and North America based on the number of Kansas carriers compliant with the UCR registration requirements.

Agriculture Commercial Driver's License (CDL) Reciprocity Agreements

Currently, Kansas has active Reciprocity Agreements with our counterparts in Missouri, Nebraska, and Oklahoma, which permit Kansas farmers to operate their commercial driver's license (CDL) class commercial motor vehicles (CMV) in interstate commerce within 150 airmiles of the farmers place of operation without the necessity of obtaining a CDL under certain conditions. A farmer benefits under this exemption when operating a farm registered vehicle with a valid driver's license in the farmer's home state. The vehicle must be registered as a farm vehicle and be controlled and operated by a farmer for the exclusive purpose of transporting agricultural products, farm machinery, and/or farm supplies to or from the farmer's farm. The federal statutory provisions in the Moving Ahead for Progress in the Twenty-First Century (MAP-21) legislation, were selfexecuting and took effect on October 1, 2012. This exemption eliminates the need for our CDL Reciprocity Agreements for the purpose of safety regulations; however, farm vehicle drivers still need the agreements for the Hazardous Materials exemptions. We continue to work on a similar agreement with representatives from Colorado.

Due to MAP-21, our CDL Reciprocity Agreements are more important now than ever. Currently, if farmers transport Hazardous Materials in interstate commerce they are not allowed to use the MAP-21 exemptions. These agreements allow a farm vehicle driver to operate up to a 150 air-mile radius from the farm in interstate commerce without requiring a commercial driver's license (CDL) and without registering in a Substance and Alcohol Testing program.

Safety Compliance Program

State law requires the KCC to verify that each new motor carrier is in compliance with the Commission's safety rules and regulations within 18 months of granting the motor carrier Commission operating authority. To advance the Division's established mission, Transportation Staff conducts both comprehensive and focused off-site investigations and audits on new and existing motor carriers, taking appropriate action upon discovering unsafe conditions. The Transportation Division also works closely with the Kansas Highway Patrol (KHP) and the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) to reduce accidents involving motor carriers through promotion of safety education to the motor carrier industry and oversight of State and Federal regulations.

In FY2022, the Division conducted 157 Compliance Reviews and Complaints resulting in civil assessment penalties against 115 motor carriers for violations of the Divisions safety and operating authority rules and regulations. The charts on this page summarize the violations identified during this fiscal year.

The KCC, KHP, KDOR and FMCSA share responsibilities in the oversight of both the state and federal motor carrier safety and economic rules and regulations. This partnership has proven to be extremely efficient and effective in contacting more carriers and drivers and in identifying high risk carriers and drivers. As a result, it is possible for the FMCSA and state oversight agencies to apply a wider range of interventions aimed at correcting high risk behavior.

These efforts have been rewarded with a measurable reduction in the number of carriers operating in an unsafe manner as well as, an improved rate of compliance among Kansas carriers when compared

to states in the surrounding region. The following charts, compiled from data provided by the FMCSA, demonstrate a couple of the metrics we use to measure the effectiveness of our safety education classes and enforcement mechanisms.

Unsatisfactory and Conditional Rated Motor Carriers for CY2021

The Safety Management Systems (SMS) provides a calendar year (CY) snapshot of the 10 Midwest States domiciled Motor Carriers (MCs) operating in interstate commerce. This data compares Kansas based MC conditional and unsatisfactory rated CR data to the surrounding Midwest MCs data. The chart below illustrates the number of "conditional carriers" and "unsatisfactory carriers" found in the past CY. Conditional carriers are those who do not have adequate safety management controls in place to ensure compliance with the safety fitness standards of the FMCSA. Unsatisfactory carriers are those who have been found to have committed violations of applicable regulations after a compliance review, have a proposed unsatisfactory or have

been rated unsatisfactory by the FMCSA. The Transportation Division has 10 Special Investigators that perform both comprehensive and off-site compliance reviews on Kansas based intrastate and interstate motor carriers. The results for the ten states comparison on the following page demonstrate Kansas has the lowest percentage of compliance reviews with a "conditional/ unsatisfactory" outcome for the CY2021, which emphasizes the effectiveness of our Education and Outreach Programs.

Commercial Motor Vehicles (CMVs) Crash Data Comparison for CYs 2019, 2020 and 2021


The clearest indicator of the effectiveness of the Division's safety efforts is the crash data of the state of Kansas compared to other Midwest states and the nationwide average. The Motor Carrier Management Information Systems (MCMIS) provides a snapshot of all crashes from US-domiciled motor carriers (MC) operating in both intrastate and interstate commerce. This direct comparison

demonstrates the Division's effectiveness in reducing crashes compared to similarly situated states as well as the national average. The results for the ten states demonstrate Kansas has the 3rd lowest percentage of CMVs and Carriers involved in crashes outcome over the past three CYs.

For safety, A CMV means any selfpropelled or towed motor vehicle used on a highway in intra/interstate commerce to transport passengers or property when the vehicle:

- (1) Has a gross vehicle weight rating or gross combination weight rating, or gross vehicle weight or gross combination weight, of 4,536 kg (10,001 pounds) or more, whichever is greater; or
- (2) Is designed or used to transport more than 8 passengers (including the driver) for compensation; or
- (3) Is designed or used to transport more than 15 passengers, including the driver, and is not used to transport passengers for compensation; or
- (4) Is used in transporting placardable quantities of hazardous materials.

Civil Assessment Program Update


The KCC and KHP partnered to enhance the Kansas Safety Compliance Program with the goal of reducing the number of injury/fatality accidents involving Commercial Motor Vehicles. The Civil Assessment Program was designed and implemented for the purpose of distinguishing the responsibilities of drivers from those of the motor carriers under the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations' (FMCSRs) "Out-Of-Service" violations. Out-of-Service (OOS) violations are violations designated as serious by the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA), and require that a driver or vehicle be removed from service until the violations are corrected. CVSA is a non-profit organization consisting of federal and state regulatory agencies, motor carrier industry, and representatives dedicated to improving motor carrier safety.

OBJECTIVE

The effectiveness of the roadside inspection program is based on information provided by the FMCSA Analysis and Information (A&I) database. The data is based on roadside inspections from both Kansas and foreign based motor carriers. The State of Kansas roadside inspections OOS rate compares the Federal fiscal year (FFY) 2021 and FFY 2022.

During this period and the OOS rate for drivers increased from a 5.79% in 2021 to 6.56% in 2022. The vehicle OOS rate experienced a slight increase from 14.71% in 2021, to 15.56% in 2022. Our continued education efforts for Kansas based motor carriers are designed to help maintain downward OOS trends, or actively correct short term OOS rate increases for our Kansas based motor carriers. These roadside inspection statistics reflect all roadside inspection activity in Kansas which include a large segment of foreign based motor carriers. (*The FFY ended 9/30/2022)

Nationally, A&I information indicates Kansas continues to have a slightly lower driver OOS rate of 6.56% compared to the National driver OOS rate of 6.98%. For the vehicle OOS, Kansas continues to have significantly lower vehicle OOS rate of 15.56% compared to the National vehicle OOS rate of 22.67%. In hazardous materials (HM) OOS, Kansas has a slightly higher OOS rate of 6.87% compared to the National HM OOS rate of 5.91%. These numbers reflect a continuing relatively static trend in driver and vehicle OOS rates both nationally and statewide.

STRATEGIES

The program focuses on the safety of the driver, equipment and the traveling public. The KCC and KHP work together on enforcement and education regarding OOS violations of the FMCSRs discovered during roadside inspections. The KCC will only issue one civil penalty for each OOS violation category. For example, if the truck-tractor of a combination vehicle is placed OOS for brakes and the trailer is also placed OOS for brakes, the company will be documented for both OOS violations, but only fined for one. The KHP and KCC will allow the civil assessment to be waived for OOS violations that are outside the obvious normal method of company operations. The KHP Trooper or local enforcement officer will have the ability to provide information to recommend that no civil assessment be issued. If the carrier has demonstrated, at the roadside inspection, that the violation was 1) potentially unavoidable; 2) the carrier has processes in place to prevent the violation; and 3) the carrier clearly has the means to correct the violation, the Trooper/Officer may recommend no civil assessment be issued. In all cases, the field decision may be superseded after the inspection is reviewed.

Conclusion

The Transportation Division has undertaken significant efforts to enhance the oversight responsibilities within its purview and has made significant improvements in motor carrier safety and economic regulation.

The Transportation Division continues to explore ways to enhance and refine its role, to the benefit of the motor carrier industry and the Kansas public.

Consumer Complaints


The Commission's Office of Public Affairs and Consumer Protection (PACP) assists Kansas utility customers when they have questions or need help in resolving an issue with a regulated utility. In FY2022, the staff handled 1,635 complaints and helped return more than \$210,000 to consumers in disputed charges. PACP staff worked with ratepayers from all across the state to get answers and resolutions. The charts to follow illustrate the statewide assistance offered and the types of complaints received by industry type as well as category.


TOTAL COMPLAINTS BY INDUSTRY | FY22






TOTAL COMPLAINTS BY CATEGORY | ALL INDUSTRIES COMBINED




CONSUMER COMPLAINTS BY CATEGORY | ELECTRIC



CONSUMER COMPLAINTS BY CATEGORY | GAS




CONSUMER COMPLAINTS BY CATEGORY | TELECOMMUNICATIONS*



CONSUMER COMPLAINTS BY CATEGORY | WATER




CONSUMER COMPLAINTS BY CATEGORY | OTHER




TOTAL CONSUMER COMPLAINTS BY MONTH | FY22

In FY2022, complaints were highest during the mid-summer and fall. They began tapering off in November at the start of the Cold Weather Rule, then returned to higher levels in April and May.

Consumer complaints trended upward slightly in 2017, then remained stable until 2021 when the number of complaints jumped by nearly 300. Concerns over controlled electric outages due to supply issues and high costs during the February 2021 winter storm fueled the increase. The numbers returned to previous levels in 2022.





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
